

Detail ing Tip of the Month

A lot of people think washing a car is easy, and it is if done properly. People do a lot of damage to the paint and clear coat because they scratch the surface from scrubbing too hard, and cause scratch and swirl marks. The following will help you from doing damage to you Corvette finish.

To start you will need:

- Good car wash-don't use dishwasher soap; it will strip all the wax off your car.
- Garden hose and spray nozzle
- (2) 100% cotton towels
- (2) five gallon buckets

Put car wash and water in first bucket and just water in the second bucket.

Fold towel in guarters and wet in car wash bucket. Rinse car with hose and nozzle to loosen dirt

Take the wet towel and lightly pull across the surface, starting from the top, hood, rear end, and then the sides.

After wiping a section with the towel, rinse it in the water only bucket to get rid of all loose dirt. Refold towel and return to car wash bucket for next car section.

Rinse car after each section. Keep surface wet at all times; don't let water dry on paint.

Wash wheels with nozzle on high spray.

Drying your car with water.

Remove nozzle, kink or turn down water to a slow trickle.

Keeping hose away from surface hold hose 3-5 inches from paint and use water to knock off big water spots.

Start at top of car and work down. Water will cause a sheeting action and most of the water will drain off.

Take the dry towel and pat the water droplets. Don't rub, it might scratch paint. Turn towel as it gets wet.

You can also use an air compressor to blow dry your car.

Remember you can minimize damage to your paint by not rubbing. Any questions or comments call.



C6 Vette SS - Bl ue Devil

For those of you that have been following the next *Corvette Supercar*, read on. From a reliable source, its motor is a 6.2L supercharged V8 and will be called the LS9. It will



be supercharged and will utilize an intercooler that is integrated into the intake manifold. The motor is making significantly more than 650hp on a test stand but it is expected to be rated very close to, if not at, 650 HP. It will not be switching to a mid-engine as many rumors have stated and it is solid enough the program code identifies it as GMX245 SSC. The body components will have significant use of carbon fiber, with at least the hood, roof, fenders and rockers while other components will be polycarbonate.

Program timing is the big item and it has never been slated for the 2008 model year. If it had, it would have started in this production year, which just isn't possible with the amount of engineering work remaining. While the original timing for the car had it starting production in March of 2008 with an annual volume of 1500 units that remains true to plan. Due to issues GM is currently having with a supplier (un-named) the start of production has slipped to July 2008.

The latest plans would put this car debuting at NAIAS 2008 in Detroit - the only auto show GM would debut a car like this at. The only way you wouldn't see this car at NAIAS 2008 is if the program suffered a major set back or was cancelled for some reason. While major set backs are always possible with such tight tolerances, cancellation would be virtually impossible, given the amount of money already invested in the program.

"There is a distinct appetite for something beyond the Z06 in performance, beyond the Z06 in exclusivity and beyond the Z06 in price," Lutz said in an interview last week.

"The car is expected to have styling cues that separate it from other Corvette models."

"Said Lutz: "Corvette has taken on the character of a brand" and can support several models."




