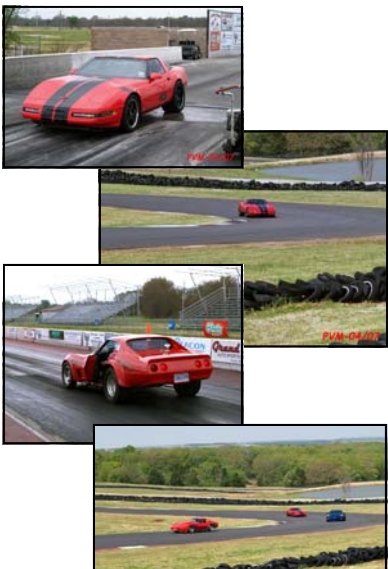

Proposed By-Laws change article for NCCC Governor.
June, 2007, Low Down:
Proposed change to read:

PROPOSED BY-LAWS CHANGE

The Board has directed the By-Laws Committee to present the following By-Laws change to the membership for consideration. It will be presented and voted on at the June 1st Club Meeting. It will be effective immediately if passed by a 2/3rds vote of those present.

ARTICLE II

2.2 Primary Member:

To become a primary member, one must be 18 years of age, attend three (3) meetings, or attend two (2) meetings and either one (1) monthly Club social or one (1) NCCC sanctioned event, and be voted in by a majority of the members present at the meeting in which the prospective member is presented for membership. All criteria must be met within a period of six (6) months. Upon acceptance by the membership, one must pay dues to the

Proposed change to read:

2.2 Primary Member:

To become a primary member, one must be 18 years of age, attend three (3) meetings, or attend two (2) meetings and either one (1) monthly Club social or one (1) NCCC sanctioned event prior to being presented for membership. All criteria must be met within a period of six (6) months. Individuals previously holding a Club membership may choose to complete the aforementioned attendance requirements or waive them. The Membership Committee must confirm prior membership before the individual is presented for current membership. Prospective members must be presented for membership at a Club meeting and be voted in by a majority of the members present. Upon acceptance by the membership, one must pay dues to the NCCC Governor.

On a related note, the Membership Committee Chair (Mo) needs to know if you have attended an NCCC event in lieu of one of the 100%er events. This will help Mo tabulate the membership awards.

Here's some information about the wine tasting that will happen at Convention this year. It will be taking place on Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday nights from 7-9 pm. It will be located in a back corner of the party room. If you wish to be a wine taster see Rose Schmidt at Convention Registration to get a ticket. Rose will also have written instructions which will include voting information. [You must supply your own paper bag. :)]

There is a "What's New" section on the NCCC Website that has Convention updates.

In other Convention news: Hospitality will be open all day Saturday and there will be a Convention warm-up party on Saturday night. All competition entrants must attend the drivers' meeting on Sunday at 2:00 pm.

Detailing Tip of the Month

- Interior Start by using your vac to clean your carpets, floor mats, and in between your seats. Next get a good leather cleaner and clean seats, door panels and console. Be careful to not use a cleaner with alcohol because it will dry out

the seats and cause cracking. Use a good leather conditioner and rub it in really good with your hand. Next take a clean cotton towel and wipe the area. Use a good glass cleaner and a paper towel to rub the cleaner in the glass and a micro-fiber towel to buff the window clean. Do the outside of the window in a vertical motion and the inside in a horizontal motion. That way if there are streaks or smears, you will know which side the problem is on. Don't forget to clean the door jams and door sills for the professional look. Also if you have a clear roof be very careful not to use an abrasive cleaner. It will damage you top. Be sure to use a rubber protect like ArmorAll to keep all of the rubber sills soft and prevent cracking.
