Now it's **1992...** still driving the metallic blue 74. Cathy & I had started dating and seemed to be getting serious. She loved the 74 as we started dating in that car. Later, we sold the 74 as we had bought a 1978 silver anniversary Vette, followed by a 1969 427 3x2 bbl 4 speed Coupe. (I'm not sure Cathy has forgiven me for selling the 74!)

The 74 vette was the start of an ongoing love affair with the true American sports car that continues today. We're celebrating 15 years together, 6 kids, 11 grandkids, and are on our 6th Corvette. We've learned to appreciate the design effort GM put into creating a car that is aesthetically pleasing and also kicks butt. Cathy and I enjoy driving our 96 LT4 in both low and high speed autocross, and she also enjoys a quick 1/4 mile drag on any given weekend. Cathy finished the 2007 race season by placing very well in both the Southwest region and nationally. We're currently building a replacement racecar for our 96 LT4 and are using a 2002 Z06 as the starting point for a race-prepared NCCC and SCCA racer. We've joined the Eagles Canyon Raceway, and are looking forward to letting the Z06 "do it's stuff" on 2.5 mile, 15 turns of asphalt.



AWARDS DESCRIPTIONS

What is a 100%'er Award?

It is presented annually to each couple or single who attends at least 11 of 12 monthly membership meetings and a Club event at least 9 of 10 months, February through November. The Club event to be considered for this award each month will be announced and designated each month in the Club Newsletter. Attendance at a concurrent NCCC event or Corvette related event pre-designated by the Elected Officers will be accepted in lieu of this requirement. In all cases, the eligible Club event(s) will be designated in the newsletter with an asterisk (*). For couples, this can be a joint venture and credit is given if just one attends the meeting or event. This award is presented at an Awards Banquet.

What is a Club NCCC Travel Patch?

It is presented annually to each member who attends eight (8) non-CTV NCCC weekends or 65% of the total number of non-CTV NCCC weekends that occur. A Weekend counts as one (1) event for each club hosting the weekend, regardless of the number of events. Participation is not required. NCCC Convention is counted as two (2) events for the purposes of this award. The award** is given to an individual member and is presented at an Awards Banquet. The car depicted on the Club NCCC Travel Patch honors the Top NCCC Competitor for that event year.

What is the Top NCCC Competitor Award?

It is presented annually to the member with the highest number of NCCC points accumulated during the event year. The award is a traveling award passed on to each recipient, and is presented at an Awards Banquet. A permanent Award** is presented to the previous year's winner.

What are the NCCC Competition Awards**?

NCCC Competition Awards** in the categories of Concours, Funkhana, Rallye, Drags and Speed Events are presented annually to the male and female in the Club who have accrued the highest number of NCCC point in each category. All types of Drag events, including Matching-Time Drags, are counted in the Drags category. All other Speed Events as noted in the NCCC Competition Rulebook are counted in the Speed Events category. These awards are presented at an Awards Banquet.

What is the Outstanding Male/Outstanding Female Member Award**?

This award^{**} is presented annually to the male and female that are considered to have helped the Club and been very active during the year. It is not a popularity contest. Balloting for this award is done three (3) times a year: at the April, July and November monthly membership meetings. Votes are taken by secret ballot. The awards are presented at an Awards Banquet. These members will be refunded their Primary Club membership dues for the following year.

What is the Charity Award**?

It is presented annually by the Charities Chairperson to the member determined to have made a significant contribution to the charity efforts of the Club during the year. The Charities Chairperson is responsible for the purchase and presentation of the award at an Awards Banquet.

Car Show Awards^{**} are presented annually for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place Car Show signifying that they are the top three (3) competitors for that given award year.

<u>Open Road Racing Awards**</u> are presented annually for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place Open Road Racer signifying that they are the top three (3) competitors for that given award year.

What are Cowtown Cruiser Awards**?

There are two types of awards presented annually for the Cruiser Program, a 1st, 2nd and 3rd place Cruiser, which is a unique trophy signifying that they are the top three (3) competitors for that given award year. In addition, they also receive the Gold Level Cruiser patch for that given year. Members who reach one of the three (3) levels of Cruiser points will receive a patch for that given year.

2007 Cowtown Cruiser Program (CCP) Results: The cruiser year ended with several participating and lots of neat places were visited by members in their Vettes. You will see from the stats below that members had a fun time accumulating their CCP points:

- 31 Members participated with 838 points for 2007
- 5 Guests participated in the cruises
- 47 Different Cities and only 15 were in Texas
- 34 Different Counties and only 9 were in Texas
- 13 Different States and guess what only 1 was TX ☺
- 17 Different Club Socials & 7 NCCC Events
- 43 Historical Markers and only 18 were in Texas
- Other visits included the NCM, Corvette Assembly Plant, NCCC Convention, Hot Springs Corvette Weekend, Creeks & Rivers, State & Nat'l Forests and Parks.


