
"Besides, the better your car, the less work you had to do when you were chasing girls. You let the car do the work. That may or may not work now, but it did then."

Otherwise, the Hoaldridges would have been racing their pink '66 roadster and/or their '67 dragster and showing their mint-condition '56 Corvette classic. The fourth 'Vette in the family is a 1981 model that Sylvia drives.

The Hoaldridges have been racing – in drag events and autocrosses (parking lot and road racing) – since 1978. They have been involved with the Cowtown club since it started in 1974, have won numerous awards and honors, and have held local, regional and national offices.

Both have been named the outstanding club members in the Southwest Region – Larry in 1982, Sylvia in 1986. [Both have also been named Outstanding Club Member of Cowtown Vettes.]

Cowtown Vettes, one of about a half-dozen NCCC-affiliated organizations in the Metroplex, is among the largest in the nation, with 110 to 115 members. It was honored as the #1 club in the nation in [competition] in 1981 and [ranked] as #1 in the Region.

[The Hoaldridges] recently built a 1,000-square-foot, detached garage and "playhouse" for their Corvettes behind their home in Fort Worth's South Hills area.

Is Corvette clubbing a hobby for the rich? "By no means," the Hoalridges say. "It is expensive, especially if you race," Larry said. "But we and the people we know aren't affluent yuppies. We work hard for a living."

"We don't have any children," Sylvia said. "That makes a difference. If we had kids, there's no way we'd have four Corvettes."

"Corvettes can be a good investment," Larry said. "The '56 classic certainly is, and the dragster. The pink racer could be, but it's mainly for fun."

Larry bought his first Corvette brand new when he was 21, and it was stolen. He [then] bought an earlier model, fixed it up and painted it pink. That's the car he had when he and Sylvia met.

But the attraction then might just as well have been a mutual fondness for bacon cheeseburgers, because they met in the parking lot of the legendary Carlson's Drive-In on University [now the site of the University Car Wash and Staples office supply store] where they used to hang out – separately – with friends.

It was an unlikely match in a way. He had gone to Arlington Heights High School, she to Paschal High School. That's almost as much of an impediment as Romeo and Juliet's. [For those of you who are unaware, AHHS and PHS were staunch rivals in the '50's and '60s to the extent that the Fort Worth ISD had the football schedules changed, so that neither AHHS nor PHS would play its homecoming game with each other.]

But even before they married in 1975, Larry's enthusiasm for the 'Vette had rubbed off on Sylvia to the extent that she attended Corvette club meetings when Larry was detained at the firehouse. [Larry just retired from the Dallas Fire Department with 35 years of service.] She became so involved in club activities that she was made the club's first Honorary Member in 1974.

Ever since, both have devoted most of their leisure hours to their cars. "There isn't time for much else."

"Corvettes are fun," Sylvia said. "And it's not just the racing. We all get together socially a lot." Money-raising for club activities and the club's special charity, Spina Bifida, also keeps members involved, she noted. [Spina Bifida was NCCC's official charity at the time of this article.]

"But the important thing is that we could sell all our Corvettes and still have friends – not just here but around the country – who will be friends for life."

Please keep in mind that the above article is 20 years old. A few changes have taken place in those two decades, namely, the '81 coupe was replaced by a '94 coupe, then with the current '99 convertible; a '68 coupe has been added to the corral of Corvettes; and the 1,000 sq. ft. garage/playhouse has been replaced with a 2,350 sq. ft. 8-car garage (bigger than our entire house in South Hills.) What has NOT changed is our love of America's sports car, the Corvette; our love of competing; and our admiration and respect for Cowtown Vettes, its members and the friend-ships we have made along the way. WHAT A GREAT COMBINATION!


