to go to the Air Force. She generously let me have her car. After all, everyone knows that "all" the Air Force people have Corvettes! It was white with a red interior—how American it looked with my blue uniform! While it did not have AM/FM-CB radio, it had a horn that played over 200 tunes. How cool is that? I was proud to serve and proud of my little sporty car. I eventually joined a Miami, Florida Corvette Club, showed my car, and bagged a trophy! I packed my bags and moved to my next assignment—Lubbock!

I heard Chevrolet was making another bright yellow corvette. My sister told me about the glass tops and adjustable lumbar seats on the new cars. I visited the Abilene dealer. MARCH IS KIDNEY MONTH

You know when you have a headache, sore throat, a cold or the flu. But do you know if you have chronic kidney disease (CKD), a potentially fatal condition that's often called "the silent disease" because it frequently isn't detected until it has reached the later stages? In honor of kidney month, know if you, family members, or friends are at risk for Kidney Disease.

Talk to your doctor if:

- You have diabetes.
- You have high blood pressure.
- You have a family history of chronic kidney disease.
- You are 60 years of age or older.
- Your ethnic background is African-American, Hispanic, Asian or Pacific Islander.

Early detection can help prevent chronic kidney disease from turning into kidney failure. Key tests to ask for include:

- A urinalysis to check for blood or protein in the urine.
- A separate urine test so sensitive it can pick up very small amount of protein in the urine.
- A check for your glomerular filtration rate (GFR), which can be determined through a blood test for creatinine. Your degree of kidney function and the stages of kidney disease you may have are largely determined by your GFR.



CHEVY UNVEILS TWO UNIQUE CORVETTE PACE CARS

History will be made at the 2008 Indianapolis 500 when a pair of distinctive yet highly differentiated Corvette models will serve as the official pace cars - one highlighting Chevrolet's commitment to fuel solutions and the other marking 30 years of Corvette's pace car heritage. Chevrolet and Indianapolis Motor Speedway officials gathered at the Indianapolis Auto Show to make the historic announcement.

One of the pace cars is a customized Corvette Z06 E85 concept that runs on E85 ethanol fuel, a domestically produced alternative fuel similar to the E100 fuel that powers all of the racecars in the IndyCar Series. It will be driven during the race's pace lap by two-time Indianapolis 500 champion Emerson Fittipaldi. The other official pace car is a black-and-silver commemorative edition that marks the 30th anniversary of the celebrated 1978 pace car - the first Corvette to pace the field at the Indianapolis 500.

Chevrolet will produce a total of 500 pace car replicas in both coupe and convertible form, each signed personally by Fittipaldi at Corvette's Bowling Green, Ky., assembly plant. The 92nd Indianapolis 500 takes place on Sunday, May 25, 2008. It will be Corvette's 10th appearance as the official pace car - a record unmatched by any other vehicle.
