
### **PRESIDENTIAL RAMBLINGS**

# PARDON FROM THE NCCC GOVERNOR

The 49<sup>th</sup> NCCC Convention in Tulsa was great. We always have fun at Convention and this one was no exception. It was good to see a large contingent of Cowtown folks there.

At the July membership meeting, I presented an overview of the various NCCC competition points systems. To recap, competitors earn NCCC points as outlined in the rulebook. The top 15 men, women and clubs are presented with awards at our annual convention. Within Cowtown Vettes, the Governor keeps track of NCCC points earned by members and presents an overall competitor's award plus awards to the winners in various categories, such as drag racing, auto-X, etc. at our annual holiday party and awards banquet. There is also a Southwest Region Championship Points Trail series where NCCC points within the Region count. Competitors earning 200 or more points receive an award. The Region also has championship categories. These points are accumulated at regional First Choice events and are combined with Regional Points Trail bonus points – which are above and beyond the NCCC national points – to determine winners in the various categories. These awards are presented at the Regional Awards Banquet that is held in late winter/early spring.

Spend a season 'chasing points'; I'll bet you get hooked on the competition and camaraderie.

There are several national officer positions up for election this year. Nominations will be completed at the September National Governors' Meeting.

for them. They put me to work in the "short line" department as they called it back then. Basically, I fixed all the oil leaks, water pumps, transmissions, (mostly manuals), and differentials. They sent me to Garland, Texas to the Service Technology Group for GM training. I took lots of classes and learned more and more. Then, I was given the opportunity to go to a class on the Corvette. It was Corvette 4-speed w/overdrive school. We learned to rebuild the entire transmission. There were lots of "special" tools involved to make the job easier. I returned to the dealership, and every day after work, I would head to the showroom floor and dream of owning a Corvette.

There was no way back then that I could have afforded a Corvette. I wanted one so bad. I was twenty-one years old., so I bought a brand new 1991 Silverado sportside pickup instead. My dad was upset with me, because he thought I'd bitten off more than I could chew on that deal, but with hard work and extra payments on the principle, I paid off the five -ear loan in just over two and a half years. I still drive that truck to this day, and people say it still looks like new.

Now fast forward to January 2003. I spotted in the paper an '86 Corvette coupe. My older brother John was happy to drive me to Waxahachie to look at the car in person. It was in great shape, and the price was right, so I bought it. My very first Corvette! It was white with red leather interior. I was so happy. I took the long way home and had the time of my life.

I was singing in the choir with Sharon Zschirnt at Edge Park United Methodist Church when I bought the 1986. When she found out that I was a new Corvette owner, she was excited for me, and told me that she and her husband Walt were members of Cowtown Vettes. (I had no idea she even cared about a Corvette, much less had one). She went on to tell me that her husband Walt raced a C3. She invited me to the club meetings. I went to a couple meetings and events and joined the club in 2003. It has been a great experience for me. The fellowship and friends are the best.

Later, I was involved in an unfortunate frontal crash, and the car was a total loss. Amazingly, I wasn't hurt, just minor cuts and bruises. Thank God for seat belts and the good sense to wear them.

A few months later, I purchased a torch red 1994 Corvette Coupe with low mileage. It was in really good shape and, with some work, I made it even better by adding lots of chrome and accessories. I quickly began the hobby of being a car show participant. I won many first place plaques/trophies and placed in many others. The car has a low 75,000 original miles.

I really enjoy the C4 Corvette, but I was ready to step up. I had been shopping around and was seriously ready to buy a new C6, but before I made a deal at the dealership, I heard that Hector Sandoval had bought a new Vette and was selling his 2004 Commemorative ZO6. I had always thought that model was the most beautiful Corvette Chevrolet ever built. I contacted Hector the day after he bought his new car. I drove to his house, looked at the car, and bought it on the spot. Hector and I are both happy that the car will stay in the club and that he didn't have to fool with the hassles of advertising the car. THANK YOU HECTOR!


I am looking forward to many more years of Vettin' with my Cowtown family. See ya'll at the meetings and events! Until then, easy on the brakes, and heavy on the gas!

The second ballot will be distributed to all members attending the August 1 membership meeting.


