

PARDON FROM THE GOVERNOR

... a report from the NCCC Governor

Thanks to all for getting the renewal dues to me. It's a very labor intensive time getting the dues recorded and preparing the portion that goes to our national organization, NCCC (National Council of Corvette Clubs). And a very large thank you to Donn Beck for collecting the renewal dues at the November meeting while I was working for the club at Texas Motor Speedway.

Some members wonder if it is optional to renew in NCCC ... or could you just renew in Cowtown. The answer is that you must renew in both. Cowtown Vettes is a 100% NCCC club which is why all CTV members must also pay national dues. A long time ago the leaders of Cowtown Vettes decided that it was important that we operate as a 100% NCCC club.

I've been asked, "I don't compete. Why should I be in NCCC?" Perhaps the most tangible benefit to your NCCC membership is insurance. As an NCCC member, you have liability coverage during club events. This includes more events than our NCCC-sanctioned competitive events. Coverage typically is provided for our membership meetings, socials, group travel and non-sanctioned events such our as practice auto-crosses and our annual car show. There are some NCCC clubs who never participate in NCCC activities; they belong solely for the insurance protection. By the way, our insurance provider is K&K Insurance. They are a long-time motorsports insurer. History buffs and old-timers will remember K&K as a NASCAR sponsor starting back in the 1950s.

There are certainly other benefits to being an NCCC member – discounts through the NCCC Sponsorship program, our competition sanction program, <u>Blue Bars</u>, the scholarship program, and the general camaraderie of being with 19,000 other Corvette enthusiasts are benefits that come to mind.

What's Coming Up

Nothing! Our regional competition season is done for the year. Your Governor is busy tallying up points for the competition awards to be presented at our Christmas Party & Awards Banquet in December.

NCCC Southwest Region News

Jeannie Ruston was elected to the Regional Executive (RE) post. Joe Reese and Cheryl Surdick will continue as Regional Competition Director (RCD) and Regional Membership Director, respectively. The bylaws changes – which was a language and style clean up – was passed. Appointed officers, pending approval from the 2010 SW Region Board of Governors, will be Mary Anne Kolb continuing as Treasurer, Brenda Lackey as Secretary, and Doug McMahan continuing as Regional Webmaster.

The 2009 Awards Banquet will be in Oklahoma City, tentatively March 6, 2010, but possibly March 13.

News for you racers: a new Sheraton will probably be the headquarters hotel for events at the Sheriff's Track in OK City. The hotel will be about five minutes from the track.

'Son of HelpNet' is in progress. Ask us about this.

A motion was made and passed to eliminate the regional event fees for Southwest Region sanctioned events. This should save CTV about \$400 a year.

NCCC National News

All of the bylaw changes passed. The most noticeable change is an expanded dependent membership program, now called Youth membership. The 2011 Convention will be in Tinley Park, Illinois, which is 27 miles southwest of Chicago.

Cowtown Vettes is #13 in the latest national club competition points standing. [Way to go, NCCC racers!]

And, finally, a friend of Cowtown Vettes and the Southwest Region, Ron Ruston (Oklahoma City Corvette Club) was elected Sergeant at Arms.


THE 2009 CRUISER COMPETITION has ended; who will win this year? You'll need to attend the December Christmas Party & Awards Banquet to find out.
