



Charity Raffles for TMS Weekend

Your C5 (and maybe your C6) Is A “Street Sweeper”

Ok, let's establish that I'm a novice having owned an '04 Vette for a little more than a year. I don't have a plethora of experience like some of you but I know there are other relatively new C5 owners out there that might benefit from what I just learned. Our engine temperature in this warm (some would say hot) weather has been above what I was comfortable with; it got as high as 248° on one particularly hot afternoon. So we checked with some other C5 owners and found that their cars weren't running as hot as ours. I've also learned about lower degree thermostats and reprogramming the fan to come on at 180° instead of 225 for better performance. However, my reasoning (should I say superior) told me that even with stock settings our car was running hotter than normal and that a lower degree thermostat wouldn't do much for a long drive in hot weather.

So the other day while wiping down the front bumper after washing the car, I glanced under the front end and saw that the air conditioner condenser coil (in front of the radiator) was nearly 50% covered with a variety of types of trash and airflow to the condenser coil and radiator was severely restricted. Design of the car is such that air flowing to the A/C condenser coil and radiator mostly comes from below the bumper within 4 to 6 inches of the street effectively make the car a street sweeper and allowing it to pick up and trap debris like leaves, grass clippings, packing peanuts, roadkill, small children, etc.

So I removed the air filter housing and unbolted (2 bolts on each side) and removed the top radiator retainer/support. You can probably get by with just removing the air bridge across the top of the radiator rather than removing the air filter housing. That allowed me to access the plastic cowling that separates the air intake housing from the chamber that flows air to the A/C condenser coil/radiator. I pulled the cowling slightly away from the condenser coil at the top and removed as much debris as possible by hand; then blew most of the remaining trash away with compressed air. Voila – we are now running about 15 to 20° cooler.

Only problem is that this isn't a one-time fix. If you drive the car, trash is going to accumulate and will need to be removed on occasion. If you do it regularly you might be able to use a shop vacuum to clean it from the bottom. Good luck.
