Diane made the wonderful spinach & artichoke lasagna and Chelsey Lowrey made two versions of her traditional lasagna. For those of you who have been around a while, you might have recognized the lasagna that I made as that of Barb Stage! Barb made that lasagna at a Progressive Dinner many years ago, and ever since, that's the only lasagna recipe I've used... YUMMY!

Speaking of the Progressive Dinner... who would have thunk we could provide that lasagna dinner for under \$5 per person!?!? And... as you might recall, we collected \$10 per person, so I have an overage of funds that I need to figure what to do with. Don't you wish you had that problem with your personal finances? Anyway, I've narrowed it down to two possibilities. The first option would be to donate the entire amount of \$270 to the Club charity fund. The cost is \$30 per person / \$60 per couple (\$50 per non-member guest) and this cost does include your valet parking at the hotel! If you are staying the night at the hotel, you will not be able to take advantage of the free valet, as a \$20 charge will automatically be added to your room bill), however, to compensate you for that, you should deduct \$10 from the \$60 per couple charge for the party. So, for example, if you are paying for two members for the Banquet, instead of writing your check for \$60, you should give me \$50.







We are not allowed to take any pictures of the children.


