



Tech Article: C5 C6 Corvette: How to Replace Interior Lights with LEDs

As some of us get a little gray, we notice that we need a little more or brighter lights. Others might just be tired of digging around in the back of the Vette for luggage on a trip. Either way, there is a better solution which you might have noticed on the newer vehicles – LED lighting!

Modifying your interior lights may seem like a big job, but it's not so difficult when you break it down. This guide will take you through all the steps and parts you'll need to replace the interior lights with LEDs. Additionally, you can opt to install LEDs for things like the foot wells, rear cargo area, backup lights, etc. without changing all the dash bulbs. I purchased a kit from Corvette Mods (other specialty shops have them) which replaced all the easy-to-do bulbs; not the door or dash bulbs.



Kits available from Corvette Mods – other add-ons are also available there.

Note: The steps in this article will be applicable to the Corvette C5 (1997-2004) as well as the C6 (2005-2013)

Tools & Materials Needed

- Flathead screwdriver
- T-15 Torx screwdriver
- Soldering iron & solder sucker
- 9V battery
- Pair of positive and negative leads
- Neo Wedge Type B (T4) LEDs w/ 10 mm base
- Neo Wedge Type A (T3) LEDs w/ 8 mm base
- Type 194 SMD LEDs
- Type 561 Rigid Loop LEDs (Type 212-2 Festoon for the '97 C5)

Before you start, it is a good idea to have a few extra LEDs. You can also test the components you have taken out of your car with a 9V battery before re-installation. Note: If one of the LEDs does not work, try rotating it 180 degrees.

Step 1 – Change the map lights

Using the flathead screwdriver, take off the map light cover to replace each bulb. For C5 Corvettes, use Type 212-2 Festoon LEDs, and for C6 Corvettes, use Type 194 SMD array LEDs to replace the stock map light bulbs. This bulb change was one the most useful ones out of the whole conversion.

Step 2 – Change the foot wells and cargo lights

You will need to gently pry out the light panels of the foot wells and cargo lights. Remove the stock bulbs and install the Type 194 SMD Plug 'n Play LEDs. The foot well and cargo lights were a HUGE improvement over stock!




Fig 2d. Before picture of the cargo light

Step 3 – Change under hood lights

For under hood lights in the '97 C5 Corvette, replace the stock bulbs with 212-2 Festoon lights. Replace the bulbs of all other C5s with Type 561 rigid loop LEDs.

Step 4 – Change the Backup Lights

Remove a taillight on each side of the car; you can do it from one side but not easy. You will use the torx driver to remove the one screw at the top of the lens on a C6 – the C5 has two screws.

Twist to remove the bulb socket/harness and then drop it out the bottom of the fascia; here you can easily change the bulb.

Step 5 – Change the automatic gear shift indicator

Gently remove the cover of your center console and pull out the shift boot. Replace the stock bulbs with small Type 194 Wedge Base LEDs; you can also replace them with a horizontal strip of LEDs trimmed to a length of 6 lights.

Step 6 – Change the door switches, dimmer and DIC panel

With a flathead screwdriver, start by removing the door switches, dimmer and DIC panel. Replace the stock bulbs of the door switches and DIC panel with Neo Wedge Type B LEDs. The narrower Neo Wedge Type A LEDs are used for the HUD panel dimmer switch. The results for these two are much brighter than stock; samples shown below

Step 7 – Change the HVAC and radio lights

This one is a little trickier and more difficult to perform than the others; especially if you don't know how to solder. You will need to remove the cover of your center console to access the HVAC and radio. To remove the HVAC and radio, unscrew their mounting screws. Lay down the HVAC and radio in a workspace where you can keep track of the components (important), and make sure you are properly grounded before taking them apart. Remove the casing of each component and then remove the circuit board. Desolder the stock bulbs from the board and attach the new LEDs. Before re-installation, test them with a 9V battery.




Fig 7b. HVAC LED placement

National Corvette Museum Ambassador

As a way of introduction, my name is Don Brown, and I am a fairly new member of Cowtown Corvettes; having joined this past summer. I am not however new to the Corvette Community and the National Corvette museum. My wife and I moved to Fort Worth from California in late 2014. We were previously members of the Corvettes of Bakersfield Club and The Bayou State Corvette Club in Lafayette, Louisiana.

I volunteered to be the Corvette Museum Ambassador for our club for two reasons: 1) I wanted to be more involved in my helping out the club, and 2) The National Corvette Museum has been a passion of mine for many years. In this edition, I would like to relate to you why the museum is so important to me.

I have always loved Corvettes and dreamed of the day when I could own one. Realistically, it just seemed like a pipe dream at one time though. About 15 years ago, my wife and I were in Bowling Green, Kentucky to attend a college basketball tournament. I had heard about the NCM and thought a visit there might be a nice way to spend an afternoon when our team was not playing.

When we walked into the museum I was amazed at the beautiful antique Corvettes that were displayed, many of which were similar to Corvettes I had grown up wishing I could own someday. - April 30-May 1, 2016: 20th Annual Super Speedway Weekend at Texas Motor Speedway. This is the same weekend as the Pate Swap Meet; which will increase traffic for our competitors and workers however it could also be a benefit. We will be having additional discussions with TMS to ensure our workers and competitors can easily get in and out of the infield area.
- June 11, 2016: the 5th Annual Corvette Scramble at Fat Daddy's. This is our forfun NCCC event that consists of a Car Show, a Funkhana and a Gimmick and Poker Rallye. This is always a fun day with your Corvette and friends.
- September 17-18, 2016: Our annual No-Frills Autocross Scramble with CCT which is typically held in the spring. We basically flipped the TMS & this event when TMS bumped us from our 18-year late-year standing event date.
