

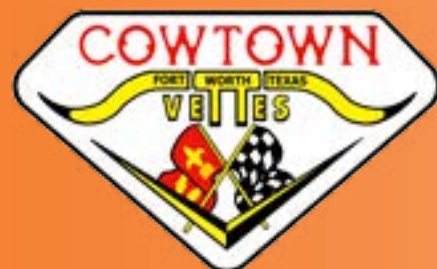

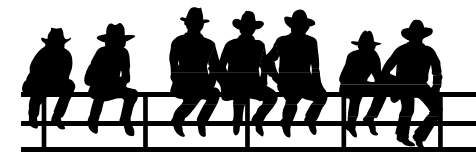
- Follow in the steps of the saints and sinners - cowboys and cattle barons - railroad workers and the earliest oil men.

Cities and counties matching the letters of the alphabet seemed like a good place to start since it paired nicely with my project of photographing Texas county courthouses. In this column last month, I discussed how I personally got involved with the activities of the National Corvette Museum. This month, I would like to discuss some of the little known activities that are conducted by the Museum. The NCM is truly more than just a place to display old cars but it has become a kind of a Mecca for Corvette enthusiasts to meet and share our hobby. In addition to this, through its programs, the museum has also become a place that supports educational efforts in the community. They accomplish this by teaching youngsters about the engineering aspects of automobiles and just basic safe driving techniques. With the addition of the Motorsports Park, Corvette enthusiasts as well as other sports car fans are able to actually put their cars through the paces in a safe environment.

First let me discuss the educational aspects of the NCM. The NCM features several learning camps throughout the year that provide youngsters with a hands-on opportunity to learn. These camps are referred to as "STEM" camps. STEM is an acronym for Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math. An example of this type of camp is the "Engineering with Minecraft" which has 3 sessions this winter. These camps bring engineering type disciplines down to a level that the students can relate to and make science and math seem "cool" to the students. Other examples of educational programs that the museum makes available to the public are the National Corvette Museum Drivers Safety Academy courses. Some examples of these courses are "Teen Driving: Car Control and Situational Awareness" and "Street Survival," both of which are designed to teach newly licensed teens safe and defensive driving techniques. Other available courses are AARP Drivers Safety Course, which is designed as a refresher for Senior Citizens, and Powder Puff Mechanics that teaches girls and women about basic car maintenance.

The next thing I would like to discuss is how the museum has become the "mother church" for the Corvette community. Each year the Museum plays hosts to several events that allow Corvette fanatics from all over North America (and sometimes from overseas) to participate in long weekend events. These events typically feature "show and shine" type car shows, information seminars, dis-

tinguished speakers, debuts of new Corvette models, and (my personal favorite) road tours. Of course the museum is also open for attendees to tour. The road tours feature scenic drives through curvy and hilly roads in central and western Kentucky and normally include visiting some of the points of interest in the area. They often include dining at some out of the way places as well and provide an opportunity to meet and visit with some great Corvette people from all over the country. This is a great opportunity for cruisers like me to network with other enthusiasts to get some insight on other parts of the country which can help me plan future Corvette road trips. In recent years the NCM has also sponsored "Museum in Motion" events. These events occur at various points in the USA and are like guided Corvette Road Tours. These tours are typically all inclusive types of tours and each participant drive their own Corvette. An example of this type of tour is the 2016 MiM Bash Dragon Run Tour to be held in May. This tour will feature a trip to the famous Biltmore Estate in Ashville North Carolina as well as a "Tail of the Dragon" run. To give my readers an idea of just how popular these tours are, this one is sold out as I write this article in early January. Finally, I will briefly mention the new Motorsports Park. I am not going to drill too deeply into this in this issue, because I plan to feature the park in a future article, but trust me when I say this park has already become an integral part of the NCM experience for competitive drivers. I also expect that the performance driving schools will be a big hit amongst Corvette fans as well as drivers of other sports cars.

So anyway, before the driving season gets into full swing, I wanted to give you an overview of some of the lesser known functions of the NCM. In the next issue, I will be discussing some of the upcoming events and how you can get involved. Thanks for reading!

At this time, the event will be held in Mineral Wells, free for Cowtown Members. We are currently investigating a couple of venues to host this event so stay tuned and watch the website!

- ***April 30-May 1, 2016:** [20th Annual Super Speedway Weekend](#) at Texas Motor Speedway. This is the same weekend as the Pate Swap Meet; which will increase traffic for our competitors and workers however it could also be a benefit. We will be having additional discussions with TMS to ensure our workers and competitors can easily get in and out of the infield area. We are currently negotiating the contact for this event.

- ***June 11, 2016:** the [5th Annual Corvette Scramble](#) at Fat Daddy's. This is our fun NCCC event that consists of a Car Show, a Funkhana

and a Gimmick and Poker Rallye. This is always a fun day of fun with your Corvette and friends.

- ***September 17-18, 2016:** Our [annual No-Frills Autocross Scramble](#) with CCT which is typically held in the spring. We flipped the TMS & this event when TMS bumped us from our 18-year late-year standing event date.
