

#### **September Events -**

#### **COWTOWN CRUISER**






So, what do you know about the Cruiser Program?? If you have been around Cowtown Vettes for a while, you probably know quite a bit, but if you are new to the club, the whole cruising concept might be confusing. When William and I bought our Corvette from Don Wells at Bruce Lowrie Chevrolet, Don kept mentioning cruising here and cruising there, but I was totally clueless. Thank goodness I didn't eventually have to expose my ignorance to anyone except William who explained that a "cruise" or "cruising" were just ways to get out and enjoy driving our Vette around the countryside...the more crooked and curvy the road the more fun the cruise...hence the birth of the CTV Cruiser Program in 2005 to encourage members either individually or in a group to get out and drive their Corvettes as well as to enjoy member socialization.





#### CORVETTE DINER - SAN DIEGO




In late June my

#### NATIONAL CORVETTE MUSEUM




Again this summer, the need to make a living has diverted me from my Corvette activities and I have failed to communicate with

the club regarding the goings on at the National Corvette museum. I apologize for this, but I have been traveling internationally a lot this year and I just have not had time to research and write a column. Unfortunately, I will not be at the meeting this month because we will be on vacation.

By the time you read this, the 22nd Anniversary celebration will have come and gone, but the museum still has many more things going on throughout the year, and the fall is really a nice time to visit Kentucky if you have the urge. I have mentioned it before, but I think it bears saying again that I have visited there on nonevent weekends and asked the nice folks there for some route sheets from their road tours and we have driven them on our own. It was lots of fun.

You know besides being a great place to visit, the museum offers some pretty helpful services to us Corvette nuts. For example, we are adding a Corvette to our garage. On the 26th of August I finally pulled the trigger on a beautiful C3 which has been on the bucket list for many years. I was able to get declared value insurance for my new toy for \$233.00 a year from the NCM Collectors Insurance Agency. This is a policy for \$30,000 and carries no deductible with full coverage insurance. The fact that we are family members of the museum helped us get a discounted rate on the insurance. The NCM recently announced the expansion of the collector insurance agency. They have doubled the staff and moved the insurance office into the main museum lobby to increase visibility.

One of the fun year round activities that the museum

September is Cowtown's last NCCC event for the year! We need you to support the club, so come to Mineral Wells and enter or work. This is a great place to try autocrossing. I love the tracks that Doug McMahan always

sets up for this event and we have lots of fun doing this one. We partner up with Corvette Club of Texas(CCT) for this and it is a great opportunity to meet and fellowship with some good NCCC members. The event is **Sept. 17-18th**; our day is Saturday the 17th but you will get 100% credit if you work or race either day. Remember, a low-speed autocross is an event that the maximum obtainable speed is 80 MPH or less in a stock Corvette. This is less that some of you drive on the highways;) So come on out and give it a try to see how much fun it is. 


