

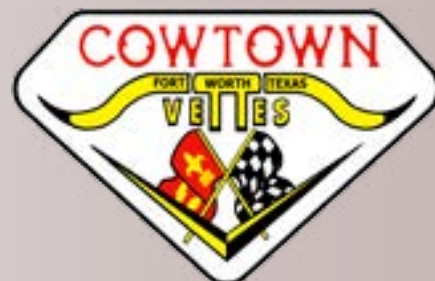

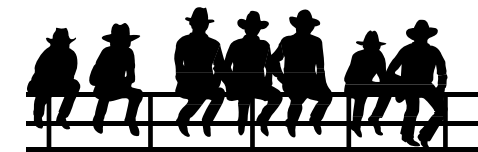

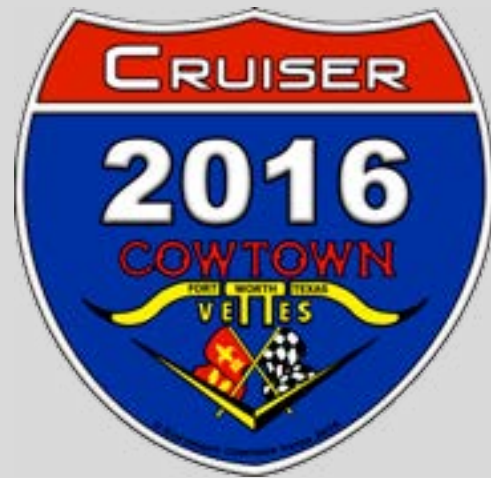

So, what do you know about the Cruiser Program?? If you have been around Cowtown Vettes for a while, you probably know quite a bit, but if you are new to the club, the whole cruising concept might be confusing. When William and I bought our Corvette from Don Wells at Bruce Lowrie Chevrolet, Don kept mentioning cruising here and cruising there, but I was totally clueless. Thank goodness I didn't eventually have to expose my ignorance to anyone except William who explained that a "cruise" or "cruising" were just ways to get out and enjoy driving our Vette around the countryside...the more crooked and curvy the road the more fun the cruise...hence the birth of the CTV Cruiser Program in 2005 to encourage members either individually or in a group to get out and drive their Corvettes as well as to enjoy member socialization.

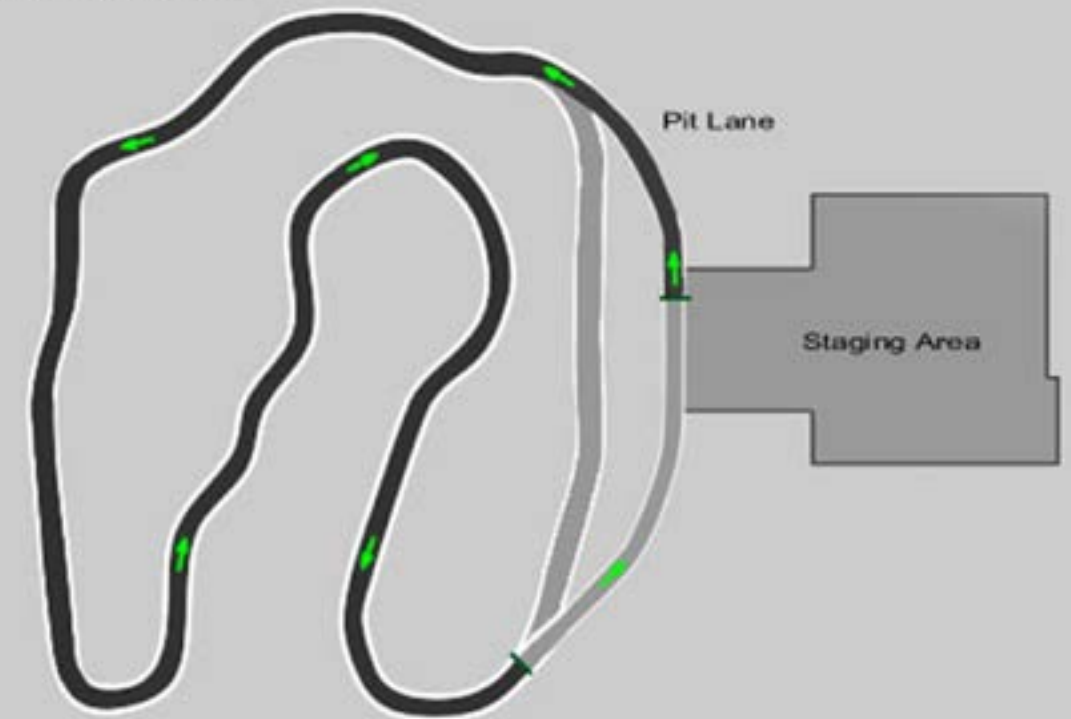


MOTOR SPORTS RANCH, CRESSON - AUGUST 13TH 2016

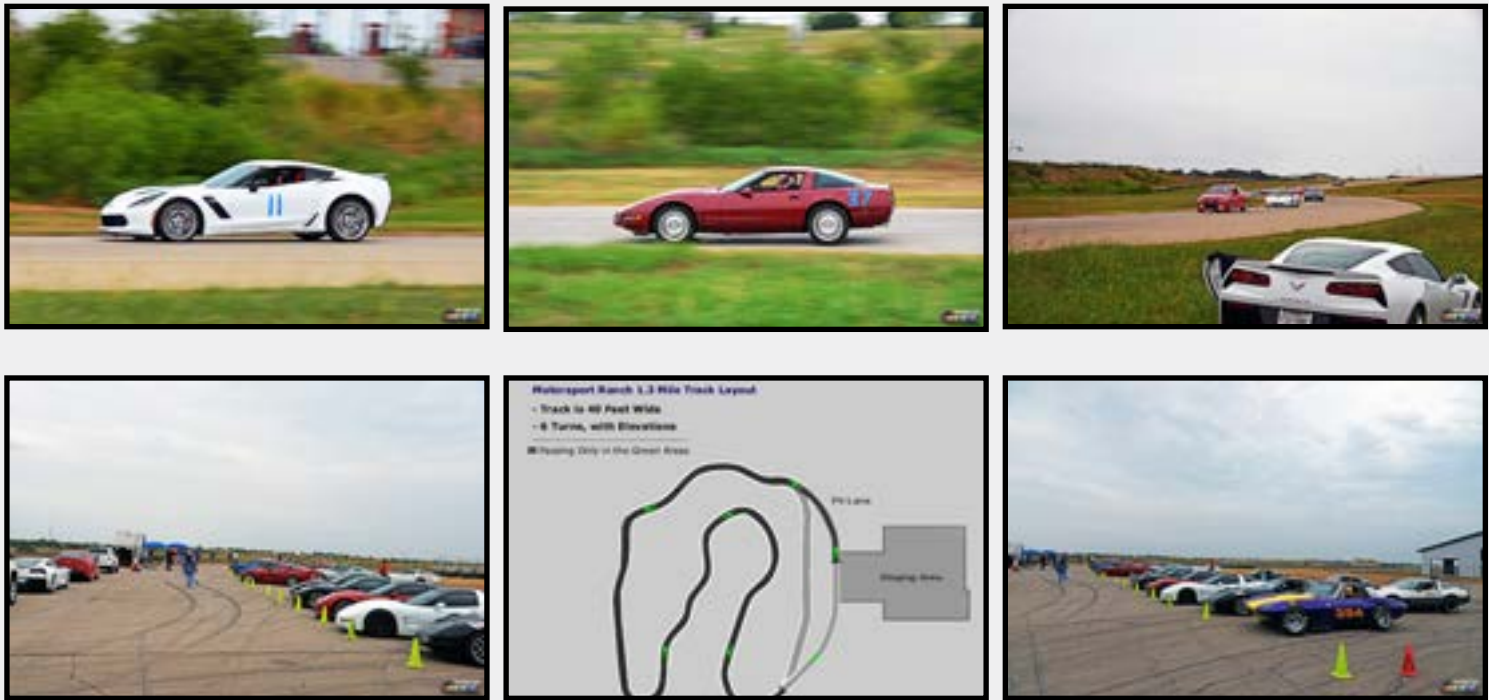
Motorsport Ranch 1.3 Mile Track Layout

I apologize for this, but I have been traveling internationally a lot this year and I just have not had time to research and write a column. Unfortunately, I will not be at the meeting this month because we will be on vacation.

By the time you read this, the 22nd Anniversary celebration will have come and gone, but the museum still has many more things going on throughout the year, and the fall is really a nice time to visit Kentucky if you have the urge. I have mentioned it before, but I think it bears saying again that I have visited there on non-event weekends and asked the nice folks there for some route sheets from their road tours and we have driven them on our own. It was lots of fun.

You know besides being a great place to visit, the museum offers some pretty helpful services to us Corvette nuts. For example, we are adding a Corvette to our garage. On the 26th of August I finally pulled the trigger on a beautiful C3 which has been on the bucket list for many years. I was able to get declared value insurance for my new toy for \$233.00 a year from the NCM Collectors Insurance Agency. This is a policy for \$30,000 and carries no deductible with full coverage insurance. The fact that we are family members of the museum helped us get a discounted rate on the insurance. The NCM recently announced the expansion of the collector insurance agency. They have doubled the staff and moved the insurance office into the main museum lobby to increase visibility.

One of the fun year round activities that the museum does, is to raffle off new Corvettes. One can participate in the drawings for as little \$10.00 for the unlimited ticket drawings. For a fun way to contribute to the NCM, you can buy tickets for \$100.00 or more. These types of drawings are limited in the number of tickets they sell. For example, a recent drawing for a new Corvette was limited to 1500 tickets. Each ticket in this raffle was \$150.00. Wouldn't it be cool for one of our club members to win a new Corvette?

Before I wrap up, I would like to mention the current and upcoming special exhibits at the NCM. Currently the museum is playing host to the IndyCar Exhibit, a display featuring cars through the years. This exhibit will end on October 14th and it will be followed by "Gone But Not Forgotten" October 21, 2016- January 6, 2017. This exhibit will Feature General Motors models of vehicles which were produced for a limited time, and are no longer manufactured.

So that is it for this month. If you are like me, fall cruising is a lot more appealing than putting up with the blistering heat of summer, so there are still plenty of reasons to visit the NCM. Thanks and happy motoring.
