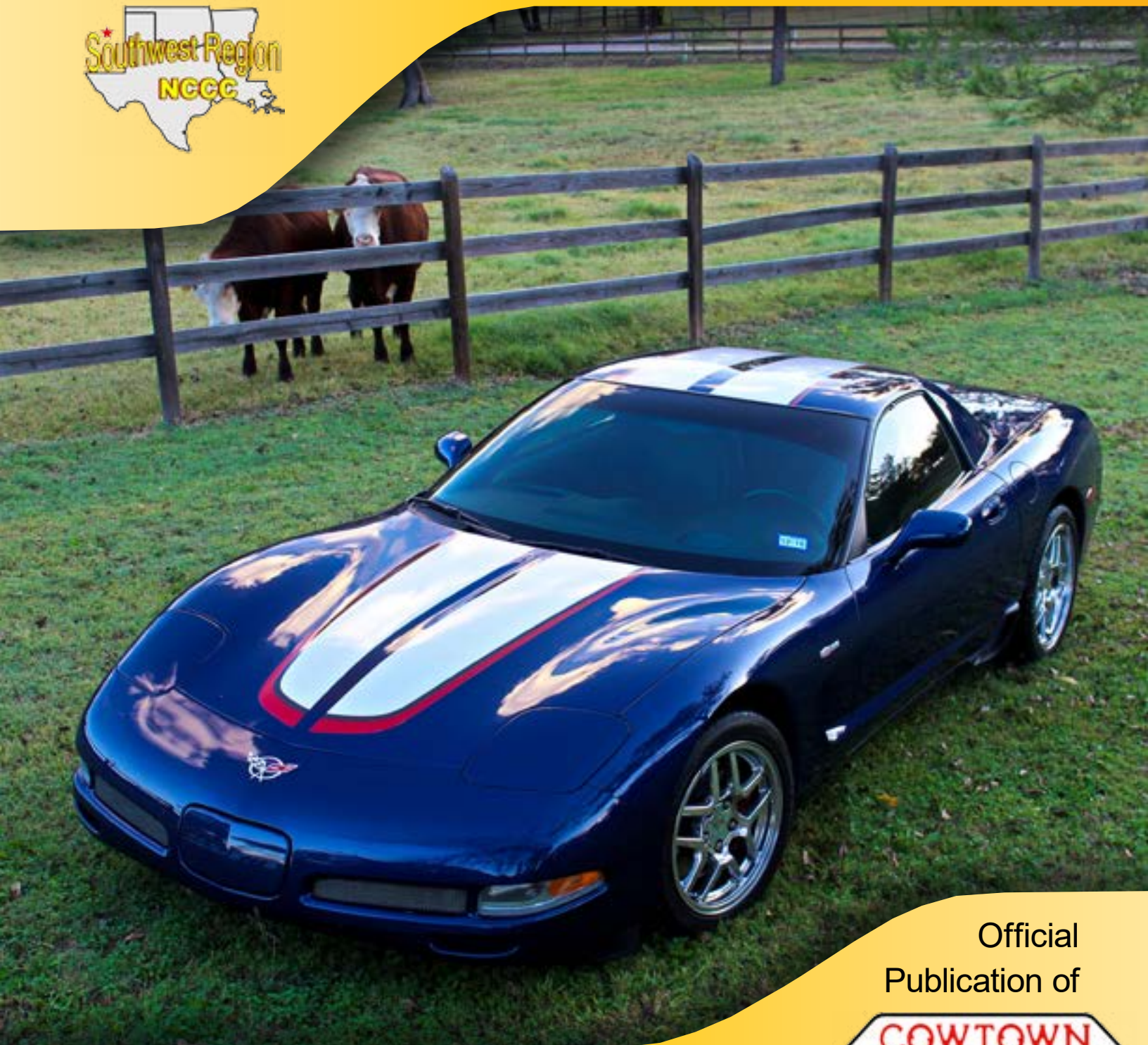


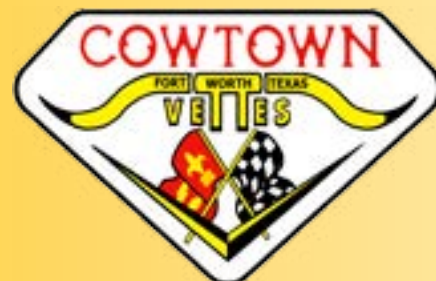

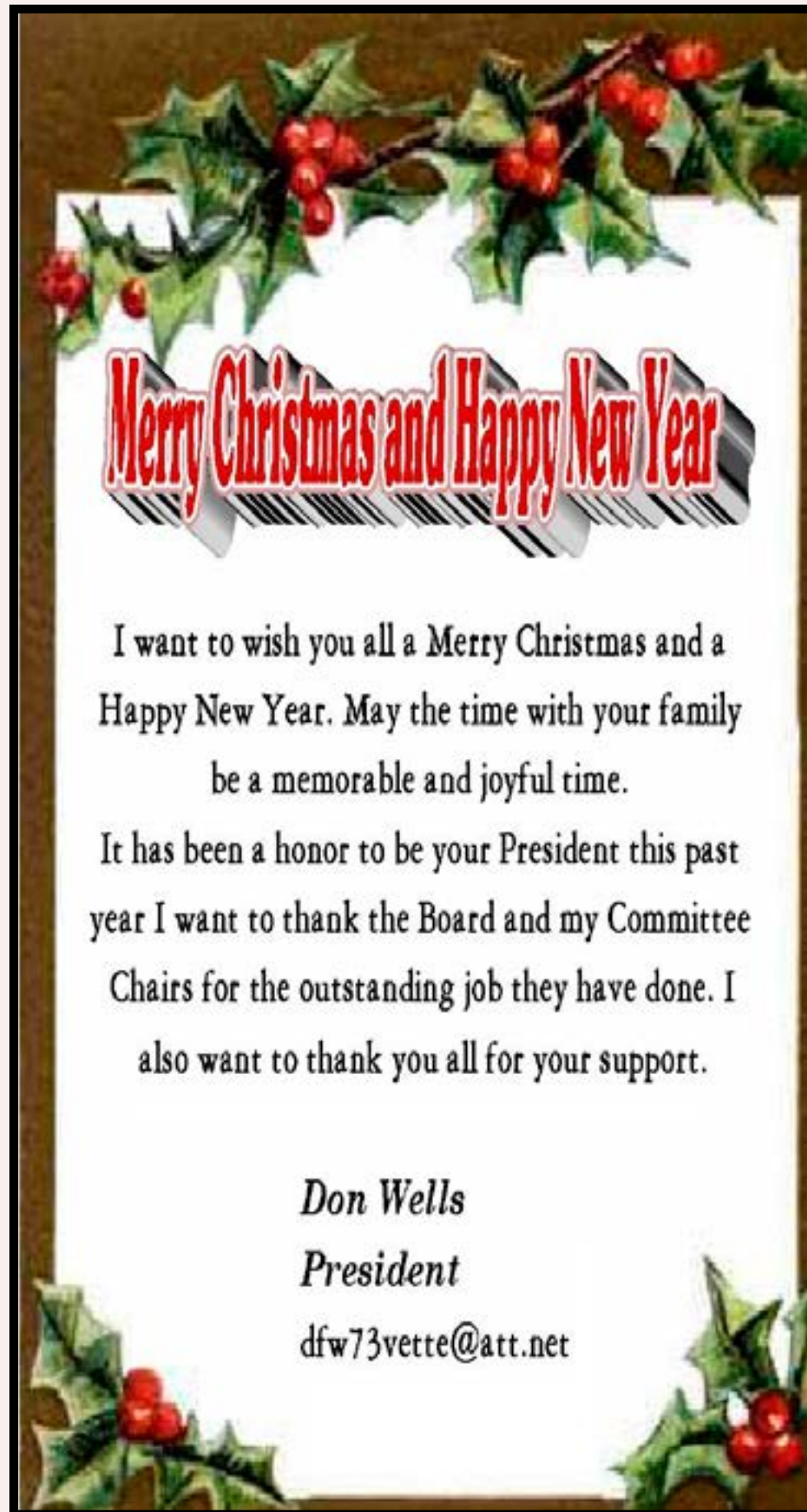

COWTOWN CRUISER



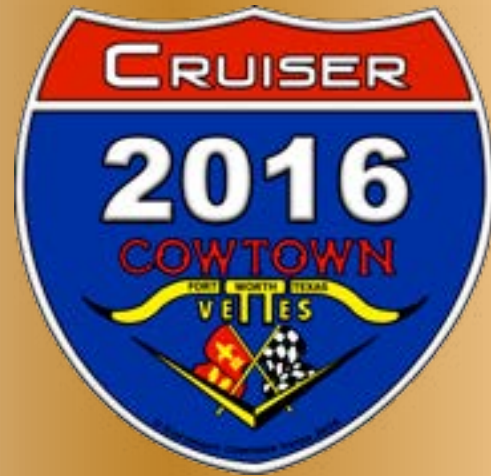

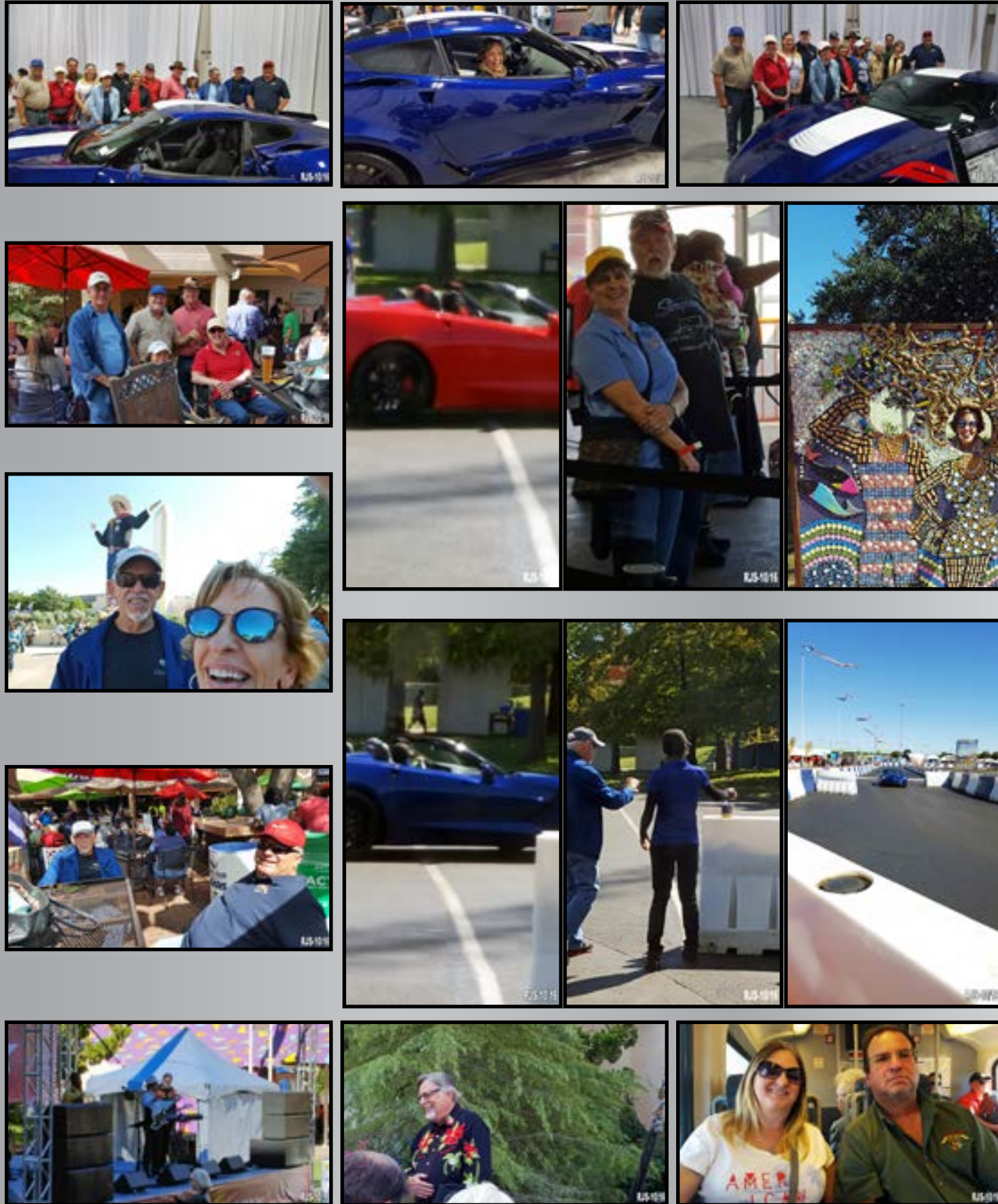

TEXAS SH 130

They say that a picture is worth a thousand words, and in this case the first photo I attached to this article should be worth at least the 400+ words I penned. A well-built and maintained roadway, a virtual absence of traffic (of all kinds), the highest speed limit in North America... and a Corvette with a full tank of gas.



I clearly remember when the road was being built, news reports speculating on the mayhem that would result from the opening of a high-speed by-pass option for the San Antonio to Austin section of I-35 that had become a virtual nightmare for drivers. As is usually the case, those pundits had it all wrong. It's a great road. Its been used for timed speed trials exceeding 220 mph and the toll cameras were designed and tested to tag cars at 180 or more. It's a road built for speed. So, back in October 2012, SH 130 was added to my bucket list.

After several years of saying "one of these days..."

this last week of October brought my wife and me to SH 130. It was great fun (see photo 2). Yeah, I know, it's interstate driving and not the fun twisty back roads that are usually favored by our members, but this was high speed driving over distance that is not usually available to us (not counting the Open Road Race event), at least legally, anyway. And, with the light traffic and great sight lines, it was speed with an added margin of safety built in.

I chuckled as we zoomed southbound and I saw (very briefly) a sign warning of a bump ahead – at a fraction of a second before I hit it. The warning was to reduce your speed to 75 mph. A number of states out there do not even allow you to drive over 65 on smooth roads while we can safely hit bumps at 75mph.

Of course, the round-trip tolls (and I'm not even going to get into my opinion on the concept of toll roads) were a bit distasteful, and at speed seemed to come rather too frequently, but what fun.

And, for the sake of full disclosure, the northern portion of the highway is listed with an 80 mph limit while the balance (approximately 41 miles) is 85 mph. Or, as someone I talked to a while ago, joked that they were suggested speed limits anyway, but I guess that phraseology was too large to fit on the standard speed limit signs.

So, for those who haven't ventured down there, it's worth your consideration. And, as an additional enticement, the City of Lockhart is easily accessible from SH 130 and is known for some of the top rated BBQ in the state.

NCCC GOVERNOR



Renewals are done and Cowtown renewed a large percentage of our membership. If you didn't make the cutoff, you can still renew, there is a \$10 late fee attached now; but you can continue with Cowtown.

I just returned from the National Council of Corvette Clubs, (NCCC) quarterly governor meeting in St. Louis, Mo. Summer was still in Missouri, so Texas is not alone. Cool weather is in the forecast so maybe we will have a couple of days of Fall before Winter.

There was a lot of info coming out at the meeting. The 2017-2018 Competition Rule book past. All by – laws passed except the one that a club maybe represented only once on the E-Board. Kathy Brisboes is now our parliamentarian with several unopposed officers taking their second term.

The NCCC Nat'l Scholarship program as moved to all online application. It will available in Jan. for members to apply. This means you, your kids, or grandkids. The deadline is May 1, 2017.

NCCC's Charity program drew the winning ticket for the Corvette/ or cash giveaway. The winner was a member of Cornhuskers Corvette Club and she will take the \$40,000 cash. This allowed NCCC to give \$14,000 more to St. Jude's Hospital as our donation this year. Our total donation was somewhere around \$20,000. The same kind of raffle will be held for 2017. Winner will receive a certificate valued at \$56,600 towards a new corvette or a cash offer of \$40,000. The tickets are \$50. And only 2000 will be sold. The winner will be drawn on Friday 8/25/17 at convention in Bowling Green, KY. You will be able to purchase EARLY BIRD tickets (\$10) for two drawings of \$250. That will be drawn at the National Governors meeting on Feb. 25, 2017 and May 6, 2017.

Spring Mountain Motorsports Ranch had another Hot Laps auction and George and Michelle Aggas won this one. There is one more to be held online the first part of 2017. Proceeds benefit the Future Corvette Owners (FCOA) and the Scholarship Grants Program.



You should be getting your 2017 Eckler's calendar before the first of the year, so be watching for it.

Convention 2017 will be loaded with plenty of things to do. Registration will open January 2, 2017. That is a month earlier than in the past. You will need to call the hotel yourself and make your reservations and you will need your NCCC number so you can get the convention rate. I will talk about this more at the meeting. There will be a tours daily along with the Corvette Plant tours; those must be booked thru the National Corvette Museum. There will be a fee of \$10 for this tour.

I will be presenting our competition awards at the annual Christmas party and will highlight those people next month. It has been a great and fun year for all of Cowtown. Looking forward to 2017, the fun and the new friends we can make.
