

Turns out Don was right!! Cruising has been great fun especially seeing more of the backroads of our great state and challenging the performance of our car.



TECH TALK - WITH DOUG MCMAHAN

Many of us have protective film on our vehicles usually right after purchasing them, to protect the paint from rock chips and hazards as we drive them down the super-clean roadways. Well, they also have protective film available to protect your clear plastic lenses, like the headlights and fog lights on C6 or C7 Corvettes. Note: Some of the companies that apply the protective film to your Vette's paint also offer the lens protection option. Note: this guide was completed on the C6 Corvette – however, the process is the same for a C7, just order the C7 lens protector kit. This guide also used the film that works with liquid to allow you to move them around before they are permanent. Some of the protectant films can't use water – read carefully before you start. **Caution:** as with any work on your Vette, picking the correct day is a big key to success. This also includes things like the ambient temperature of the day of your project. Installing the lens protectors is easier when the temperature is 700 F. or warmer. The manufacturer warns to never install the protectors when the temperature is 500 F. of less. Personally, I have warmed the lens protectors with a hair dryer just prior to installation, making them more pliable.

Let's Get Started

1. Be sure to purchase the correct lens protectors for your year and model of Corvette. While the headlight protectors are the same from 2005-2013, the lower lens is drastically different between the base coupe and the wide-bodies.

2. Thoroughly clean the lens using a good glass cleaner. Dry the lens with a lint free cloth. To avoid staining the Headlight and Turn Signal Protectors, make sure your hands are clean and dry before starting. 3. Dry-fit the Headlight Protectors, WITH THE BACKING ON, to get a feel for how they fit. Note: it does help at this stage to have an extra set of hands and eyes to help line up the upper and lower corners. Once you have the protector lined up, you can leverage small pieces of painter's tape to hold in place. 4. Lightly spray a water/soap mixture on the lens which will allow you to move the film if you are off just a little. 5. DO NOT touch the adhesive part of the lens protector or you will leave visible finger prints. I would recommend starting in the upper corner peel back 1" of the backing paper, and FOLD UNDER exposing only 1" of the adhesive part. Handle only where there is backing paper; do final alignment with the corner, and stick that exposed portion down to the lenses; working from the center, press the material down, and work toward the outer edges. (If you are off on the alignment, you can CAREFULLY pull the film loose and realign it). I used a soft but firm squeegee to help remove the air bubbles and water – some film kits come with these. 6. Pull the backing only 1" at a time, working it from the center, press the material down toward the outer edge, watching for air bubbles as you go. If you discover an air bubble, pull loose only as far as you need to work out any air bubbles; yes you will have some. HINT: Due to the curvature of the headlight, you must make sure you work the edges down, the tendency of the protector is to buckle at the edges. 7. Your backing paper will naturally fold under as you move down and over on the headlight. Be sure to periodically recheck your film alignment each time you move 1", by laying that part of the protector with the backing still on, down on the headlight. If you are drifting slightly, then you can actually pull the protector slightly, in the direction you need to go.

8. I found it necessary to use a hair dryer as I installed – to help the film to lay correctly and to help dry the part of the film that was finished.


9. For the lower lens protectors just follow the same procedure as the headlight protectors above. They are actually a little easier since they are primarily curved only in one direction. Again, dry fit first for alignment, then pull back 1" of the paper backing, and stick down, and move across the lens 1" at a time pressing the material down from the center toward the outer edge, once again, check the alignment each time you pull 1" of the paper back.

After You Finished – After installing the protectors, the manufacturer states for you to not wash your Corvette for at least 72 hours to allow the adhesive to properly set up. The fine white lines and blemishes under the lens protectors are normal and will disappear in a few days.

They say that a picture is worth a thousand words, and in this case the first photo I attached to this article should be worth at least the 400+ words I penned. A well-built and maintained roadway, a virtual absence of traffic (of all kinds), the highest speed limit in North America... and a Corvette with a full tank of gas.



After several years of saying "one of these days..." this last week of October brought my wife and me to SH 130. It was great fun (see photo 2). Yeah, I know, it's interstate driving and not the fun twisty back roads that are usually favored by our members, but this was high speed driving over distance that is not usually available to us (not counting the Open Road Race event), at least legally, anyway. And, with the light traffic and great sight lines, it was speed with an added margin of safety built in.

I chuckled as we zoomed southbound and I saw (very briefly) a sign warning of a bump ahead – at a fraction of a second before I hit it. The warning was to reduce your speed to 75 mph. A number of states out there do not even allow you to drive over 65 on smooth roads while we can safely hit bumps at 75mph.

Of course, the round-trip tolls (and I'm not even going to get into my opinion on the concept of toll roads) were a bit distasteful, and at speed seemed to come rather too frequently, but what fun.

And, for the sake of full disclosure, the northern portion of the highway is listed with an 80 mph limit while the balance (approximately 41 miles) is 85 mph. Or, as someone I talked to a while ago, joked that they were suggested speed limits anyway, but I guess that phraseology was too large to fit on the standard speed limit signs.

So, for those who haven't ventured down there, it's worth your consideration. And, as an additional enticement, the City of Lockhart is easily accessible from SH 130 and is known for some of the top rated BBQ in the state.

TEXAS SH 130

One of the biggest events of the year at the National Corvette Museum is the Spring Bash which is slated for April 27-29. This event features several activities highlighted by the rollout of the new model 2018 Corvette. This provides enthusiast a first look at the new model. Also as always at the bash, there will be a large contingent of designers and engineers from the Warren Tech Center and the Bowling Green Assembly Plant on hand to answer questions about the C7. For those of us who are gear heads, there will also be a LT4 Engine building demonstration by BGAP Rob Nichols and Brian Lee.

Another activity slated for the Bash includes a high performing driving school. This is driving school is being conducted at the NCM Motorsports Park which is adjacent to the museum. The school requires an additional registration and fee. Bash attendees who are curious about the school as well as the Motorsports Park can view the driving on the track for no additional fee. Additional activities include a couple of road tours which are always fun. One of the road tours is the Rough River Dam State Resort tour. Cindy and I went on a tour that was similar to this several years back and we enjoyed it. An other scheduled road tour travels to the International Blue Grass museum and this one looks to be a lot of fun. If shopping is your thing, there is a bus tour that goes to Opry Mills Mall. There are also several seminars to attend as well as a

show and shine type of car show, autocross, a comedy show banquet, and much more.

In addition to the Spring Bash, a "Museum in Motion" event is

scheduled for immediately after the Bash beginning on April 30 and concluding on May 3. This event is called MIM Dragon Run @ Biltmore Estates and consists of a guided road trip through the famous Tail of the Dragon road and onward to the Biltmore Estate, former home of the Vanderbilt family in Ashville, North Carolina. Even though we have never taken the MIM tour, Cindy and I have visited both the Tail of the Dragon as well as Biltmore and I can assure you this would be a wonderful experience. Last year when we attended the Anniversary Celebration, we met some really nice folks who are avid attendees of the MIM events and they told us they are fantastic events and are always well organized and hassle free. I will say this though, the MIM events fill up fast, so if you want to do this one it would be a good idea to reserve your spot early.






