

COWTOWN CRUISER




September, how can it possibly be September...this year is just flying by as is your opportunity to participate in the 2018 Cruiser Program.

What I Learned at Corvette Convention as a "Newbie"

In July 2018 we had the opportunity to attend our first NCCC National Convention which was held in New Orleans, Louisiana. To say it was in New Orleans was a bit of a misnomer since we were over in Metairie, Louisiana which is a \$25 to \$30 dollar cab ride to the French Quarter from where we were....however, after just a little time in the French Quarter, being over it Metairie didn't seem too bad....lots less crazies than on Bourbon Street.




