



The Board is hoping that July will be some way back to normal. Gayle Cherry is working on some great socials, and Robert Gyer and David Gill putting some cruisers together.



Amy & Korey Rogers - Amy is a part time nurse at Baylor Scott & White Medi-





He sent some pictures of the deer, their dogs posing in the bluebonnets and the Vette being washed at the firehouse.






Mary Pittman and William Nolan - Mary continues to work part time as a pharmacist at Cook's Children's Hospital, so she is also on the front line. They


**Johnny & Anna Shotwell** – Johnny has worked from home for years, so that part of his day hasn't changed. However, he says there are some hardships for him.

- We will be hosting our first virtual Southwest Region Governor's Meeting on Microsoft Teams within the next couple of weeks.


Larry Dyer - Another club member who enjoys working on cars. He included a nice picture of his El Camino:










Unfortunately, we had to cancel this years **Annual Fat Daddy's Spring Scramble**.
