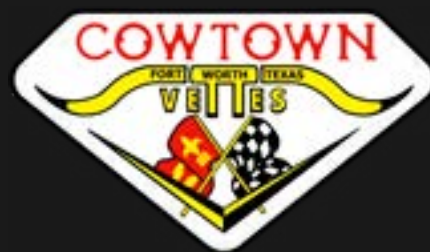

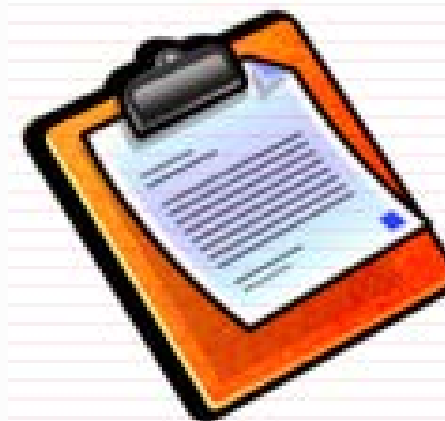

10 THINGS YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT CARS (in Australia)

1. Swedish maker Volvo invented the seatbelt over 50 years ago. But did you know they haven't charged a single car maker for the use of the patent?
2. Anti-lock braking systems (ABS) first appeared on volume-selling cars when Mercedes Benz introduced the technology on a flagship model in 1979. Today ABS is standard because since late 2011 stability control is legally required on all new passenger cars sold in Australia.
3. In the early 1900s there were more electric cars on North American roads than there were petrol-powered cars. But limited battery range - and the emergence of oil and the internal combustion engine - saw petrol powered cars win the day. Well, for the first 100 years...
4. By early 2010 there were more than 2.2 million petrol-electric hybrid cars on the road (after 12 years). The first mass-market electric-only vehicles began to arrive in showrooms in 2012.
5. Electric cars won't replace petrol-powered vehicles; experts predict about 5 per cent of new cars sold in Australia in 2020 will be electric only.
6. The internal combustion engine (petrol and diesel) isn't going anywhere. There are more than 800 million vehicles on the planet that rely on petrol or diesel. As oil supplies diminish and/or become more expensive, we will increasingly rely on bio-fuels, such as ethanol-blended unleaded petrol and bio-diesel.
7. General Motors was the world's biggest car maker for 77 years (1931 to 2007) but it was overtaken by Japanese maker Toyota soon after the Global Financial Crisis.
8. Contrary to perception, the world's biggest selling car is the Toyota Corolla. The first big seller was the Ford Model T from the early 1900s (16.5 million sales), overtaken by the Volkswagen Beetle (21.5 million, not including the modern version). The VW Golf, on its sixth generation, is up to 24 million sales, close behind the tally for the Ford F Series pick-up (25 million). The Corolla total? A cool 35 million, and still counting.
9. Self driving vehicles may be hitting the roads sooner than you think. Companies like Google are busy testing prototypes for fully autonomous vehicles, but according to recent research, "incremental automation" (such as autopilot capability on the highway) is looking a lot more promising for the next three to five years.
10. Australia invented the pick-up (what we call a ute), which went on to become North America's biggest selling vehicle for almost half a century. The humble ute celebrated its 80th anniversary in 2014. According to Ford historians, in 1933 a Gippsland farmer's wife wrote a letter to Ford asking: "Can you build me a vehicle that we can go to church in on Sunday, and my husband can use it to take the pigs to market on Monday?" Lew Bandt, then a young designer at Ford in Geelong, came up with concept to combine a car with a load carrying vehicle. Eventually it was approved and went into production in 1934.

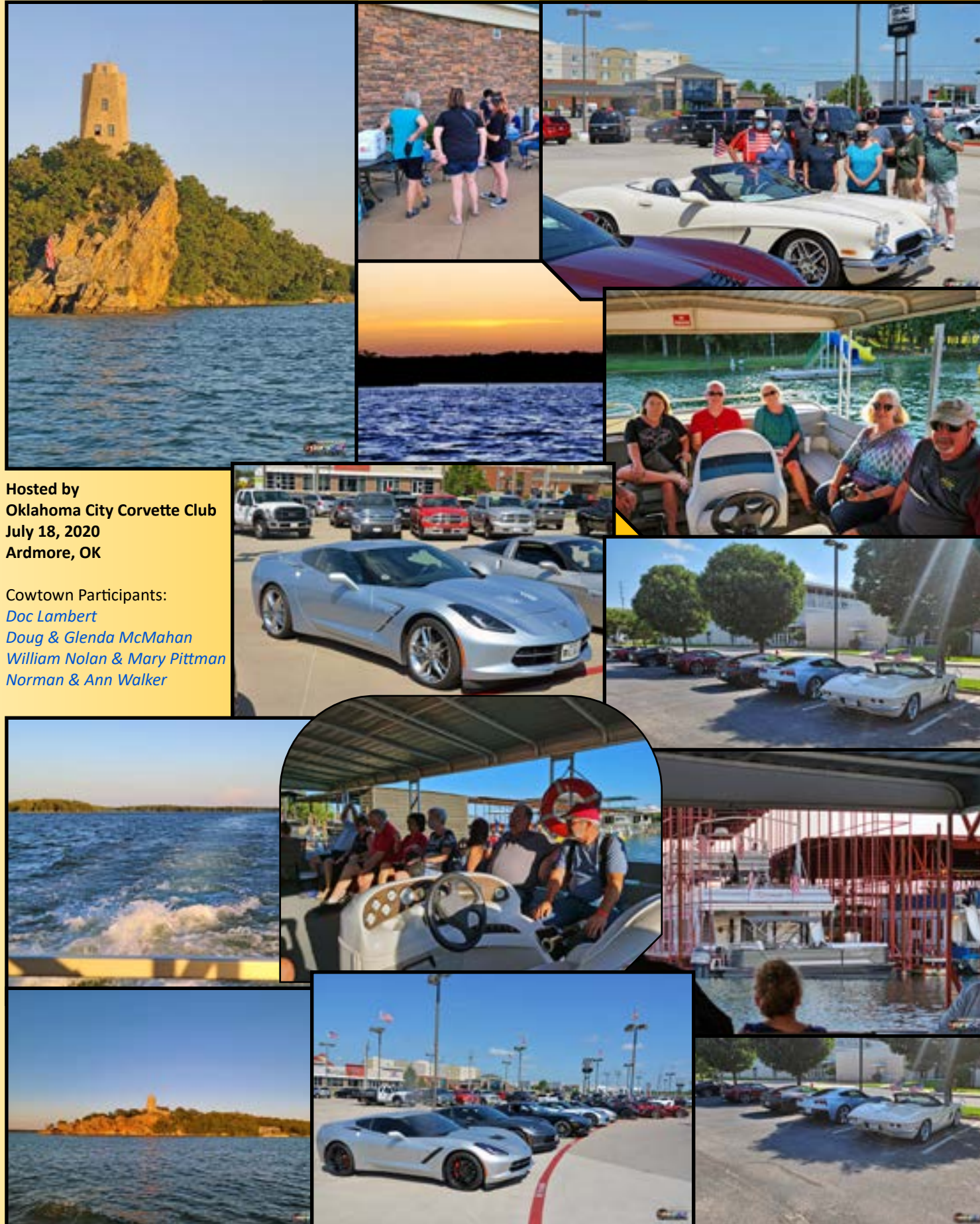

NATIONAL CORVETTE MUSEUM NEWS

This year marks the **26th Anniversary milestone** and focus on the diversity of the people that Corvette has brought together for a look back on the Museum's history and forward to the future! Registered participants can enjoy 4 days of activities in and around the Museum including access to interesting and unique road tours, special video presentations, raffles, and more during this event in honor of your help and support! The event will also include the **Winner's Circle dinner, 10/15/20/25-year member recognition**, and the **"Corvette Hall of Fame" Induction Ceremony and banquet** where we will induct new members into the prestigious and elite group of recipients who have made a significant contribution to Corvette history.

Help foster a love for Corvette, generate interest in the Museum, and create future hobbyists with the **Next Generation Membership** - designed for children from birth to age 18. Benefits of the program include: Free Museum admission; 10% Corvette Store discount; Free cookie in the Corvette Café when visiting (limit 6 per year); Discounts on NCM sponsored children's programs; Membership packet including toy Corvette when joining; Quarterly emailed newsletter; and Birthday gift each year. Next Gen memberships are a one-time tax-deductible donation of \$400 for kids age 9 and under; and \$200 for kids age 10-18. The membership is valid to age 18.

The **1.75 millionth Corvette**, an Arctic White Coupe with Adrenaline Red interior, will only temporarily call the National Corvette Museum its home as it will be used in a fundraising raffle by the Museum. This Corvette will be raffled on **Friday, September 4 at 3pm CT** as part of the Museum's 26th Anniversary Celebration event and features the Z51 performance package, 3LT equipment group, 5-trident spoke machined-face sterling silver aluminum wheels, engine appearance package, front lift adjustable height with memory and more. The car will be delivered via the Corvette Museum Delivery program, also referred to as option code R8C when ordering a new Corvette, which provides a red carpet V.I.P. experience for the winner and up to three accompanying guests.

After being closed nearly three months of their prime tourist season, the National Corvette Museum has announced an extension of a special exhibit that debuted in late January. **Cartoon Creatures, Kustom Kars and Corvettes: The Art and Influence of Ed 'Big Daddy' Roth** will now run through April 2021.

"We have 14 cars displayed, beginning with actual hand-built Roth cars, leading to the Rat Rods and custom cars he inspired others to make." The exhibit features several cars from Galpin Auto Sports, with one car – the **Wish-bone**, having been unveiled at the Museum for their Discovery Channel tv series 'Driven.' The exhibit ends with **Crosshairs** and **Sideswipe**, two Corvettes designed by Peters that would go on to star in the **Transformer** films.

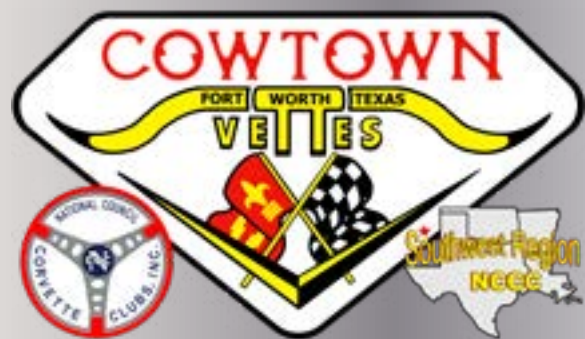
