April 23rd thru 25th 2021



We along with Mary & William, have been planning to make a trip to the NCM since hearing the Ed Roth's Rat Fink Exhibit arrived, back in 2020. Well, with Covid-19, furloughs and everything else going on, we almost waited



too long since the exhibit left the NCM on May 2nd. Some of us grew up building the model kits and enjoying the artwork of Ed's Creations. Do you remember his creations, like the Beatnik Bandit, Wishbone, Mysterion, Tweedy Pie, etc? In addition to the NCM, we had a few other targeted visits for this trip. One of these was a Facebook friend I've come to know over the past year, as he was completing his '63 Split-Window Restomod. I've visited with him from time-to-time on the phone and via Facebook messenger and he mentioned "next time we were in the area – come by to visit" so we did. His passion is the Full Octane Garage (they have two locations) where they build and work on various vehicles and create a lot of YouTube videos, not to mention that they broker collector car insurance.

We planned our trip to the Nashville area to enjoy the Full Octane Garage on Friday, after spending the night in Jackson, TN. We were a little early, so we headed further south to Columbia, TN. It turned out to have a neat

downtown area, with restaurants, brew pubs and yes, several cruiser points. When we parked the Vettes to walk around, William commented that Mike Wolfe's van (American Pickers, Antique Archaeology) was over at the Columbia Motor Alley – you just never know what you'll see while traveling the backroads.



We finished lunch, enjoying a brew, walking around the square so we headed north to Brentwood, TN where the Full Octane




Garage (north) was located. It was a nice twisty drive up to Curt's home and garage (upper and lower) where located; he met us as we pulled up. Since we are building a '67 restomod, it gave us a chance to look at some things we are planning to ours, such as electronic power brakes, the Ididit tilt-steering, Vintage Air, just to name a

share all about his car and things he encountered building it – he was very informative and helpful. We left there after spending a few hours and headed north to Nashville, where we checked into our hotel. That evening, we enjoyed strolling around, specifically Broadway. This was the first night that the mask mandate was lifted outdoors, and we saw very few masks. We had a good time, enjoyed a nice rooftop dinner, some live music and a brew or two.




Saturday was a drizzly day however, we headed north into the Kentucky bourbon country, stopping first at Maker's Mark Distillery, one we have visited a few times. We enjoyed lunch, some tastings, walking around the gorgeous grounds, etc. Next, we headed to another one of our favorites, Buffalo Trace Distillery – wow, were they busy!!! 6 registers active and still a 10-15-minute wait to check out. They have one of my favorites, Eagle Rare however they were out of it this Saturday. We wanted to visit the Jim Beam Distillery (Basil Hayden) however, it was still closed to the public, like several other things in KY; virtually all wineries were still closed. We finally headed back south to Bowling Green, to spend the night and grab a really nice dinner at a neat downtown restaurant.



Sunday morning we headed over to the Corvette Assembly Plant (currently closed to the public) however we saw a pair of C8 convertibles on display. One was the Red Mist – and wow, the color is outstanding. After a few pictures there, we headed on over to the NCM. We located two of Cowtown's Bricks along with the NCM Bench I created the artwork for. Inside we viewed the various exhibits, including the sinkhole cars – it was nice to see a couple restored since our last visit. Then finally we came to the Rat Fink Exhibit. It was well worth the trip to the NCM to see this collection of a small collection of Ed's artwork and creations. Once we finished looking at all these, we headed over to the Motorsports Park, which we couldn't enjoy driving the track this weekend due to a 2-day HPDE event going on. There were lots of entries and we were able to drive around and see how much it has grown since opening day when we were there. On the backside of the parking lot we saw over 75 C8 Corvettes, many with window

stickers. We first thought these were ones they use in their Corvette Experience offering however, we found out they were C8s awaiting their turn for museum delivery – what a backlog!

Departing Bowling Green, we planned to take the backroads, to start our journey home. We headed west on 79, traveling thru the Land Between the Lakes (on 68), in southwest KY; it is a pretty drive with good roads and less traffic – need I say more? Our stop for the night was Paragould, AR, where we grabbed dinner. We actually met William's niece and kids for dinner. The real surprise – maybe a shock, the restaurant had \$1 draft beer on the menu – when we asked what the beer was, he said Yuengling – what a surprise! We spent the night at his sister's condo (their 2nd home). On Monday morning, we continued down the backroads until we arrived at Little Rock, then it was Interstate the rest of the way home.



ROADTRIP TO MUSEUM AND RAT FINK







I have had a passion for Corvettes since I was in high school. My cousin dated a guy who had a split window, '63 coupe that I thought was the coolest car. I thought I needed a Corvette! When I was a senior, I had saved my money from mowing lawns and working at a restaurant on weekends, so I went shopping for a Corvette. I found a new '67 convertible at a dealer for \$4189. I had about \$3000 so I went to my dad to borrow the remainder and he said I did not need a Corvette. I went shopping again for a muscle car and decided on a new '67 442. It was \$3130. My dad said yes! It was a beautiful car, burgundy with a black vinyl top, a 4 speed with Hurst shifter, no ac, power brakes or power steering, just muscle.

That 350 hp would smoke the tires from the start and get rubber in all 4 gears. I only got 11,000 miles out of my first set of tires. My dad was not pleased. I mowed more lawns to buy tires and insurance. Did you ever see a young man driving around in a new 442 with a lawn mower sticking out of the trunk? That is determination!

I loved that car but it did not satisfy my yearning for a Corvette, so after college and 3 years into my job and 3 little girls I convinced my wife we needed a Corvette.

One Friday on the way home from work in the spring of 1975, I stopped by a Corvette lot in Richardson and looked at a 1974 orange convertible with 14,000 miles on it for \$7,100. I went home and got my wife and girls and I drove it home that evening. I was racing sailboats at the time and had a custom hitch made for it so I could pull my 15 foot sail boat to the races. We really enjoyed the car. All three of my girls would get in the back with the top down and stick out their heads between the seats and we would go for rides and short trips. They thought the car was really neat!

I never did anything with the car like show it or autocross. I drove to an autocross once to check it out. It was put on by Lone Star Corvettes and was nothing like any NCCC autocross. They used reverse too much for me.

Ten years and 174,000 miles later, after new paint and a rebuilt transmission the first person who looked at it gave me \$8,000 for it. The only thing other than gas, tire and oil, I spent on the car was \$16.00 for axel bearings and my neighbor put them in for me.

Fast forward 20 plus years and I convinced my wife I needed another Corvette. It took several serious conservations but she finally believed I really needed and deserved a new Corvette. She bought me a new 2012 grand sport. I told her I never would never need a Christmas, birthday, Father's day or other present again. I was like a dog who just caught a car he was chasing I did not know what to do with my catch. I started showing the car because my salesman said I would really enjoy it and he was right. The first show I went to I won sponsors choice! It helped that my salesman's dealer was the sponsor of the show. I showed the car intensely for seven years and did quite well with it. Sometime I would go to 2 shows on Saturday and occasionally one on Sunday. It was not unusual to go to 30 shows a year. After I started autocrossing about five years ago from March through November nearly every weekend I was showing or racing.

I autocrossed my Grand Sport a time or two then decided I needed an older car to autocross. I convinced my wife to buy me a '95 to help out one of my daughter's friends.

It needed a lot of work but with enough money it became presentable. I raced it about two years and then convinced my wife I need a '96 with a LT4 engine. Now I had three Corvettes and several people said that was a good start. Last year I inherited my daughters yellow '81 Corvette so for a short time I had four Corvettes. In the same week I sold the '95 and the '81. Just have two now.

I am hooked on autocross and with Covid, NCCC canceled all racing for 2019, but I just wanted to drive my car. I joined SCCA and raced two events locally and trailered my car to four events in Oklahoma City. With all six events I got 42 runs on my car. I'll get that many in Drumright on Memorial Day weekend. I had no other choice; I just wanted to drive my car.

This year at our practice autocross I drove my car 16 times. I trailered my car to SCCA events in Muskogee Oklahoma for seven runs, Eagles Canyon Raceway for four runs and Lone Star Park for five runs. NCCC is a much better deal but I just wanted to drive my car.

I'm looking forward to the NCCC season but there is a big gap between our first event on Memorial Day and our second event in September. I guess if I want to drive my car I'll have to humble myself and enter more SCCA events.

Kaye and I have started going on the cruises offered by the club. They are fun and it is something we can do together and I can drive my car.




The competition season is in full swing around the country, with events of all types happening. For Cowtown, we have our **9th Annual Corvette Scramble coming up on Saturday, May 15th at Fat Daddies in Mansfield.** The day's festivities include four events: a Car Show, Funkhana and a Gimmick & Chance Rallye (run simultaneously). I will include some pictures from some previous year's events in the May Slideshow. Below, you will find a description

of each event and feel free to ask any ques-

tions you might have.

- 1. CAR SHOW: ours is a Participant's Choice simple, the participants vote for their favorite in each class.
- 2. FUNKHANA: an event with the added features of a navigator to assist the driver and a variety of gimmicks that the driver and/or navigator must perform in order to successfully complete a run. Some Funkhanas require



- 3. GIMMICK RALLYE: A Gimmick Rallye is one in which the Rallyemaster presents route instructions and questions that the alert Rallyists must follow and answer along the Rallye route. The Rallyists can be required to test out their navigational abilities and match their wit and skill with the Rallyemaster. Answers to questions may be found on either side of the road. This Rallye is scored by following instructions, providing correct answers and being in by the pre-announced time given by the Rallyemaster in the "Generals" or at the Entrants Meeting. This Rallye is NOT scored by any type of CHANCE or unknown factor.
- 4. CHANCE RALLYE: in our case, is combined, run simultaneously with the Gimmick Rallye. Ours is a POKER RALLYE, where luck is most important. You will draw your first card before departing on the Gimmick Rallye, then you will arrive at three different checkpoint along the route, where the DRIVER or NAVIGATOR draws a card. One final card will be drawn at the end when you turn in your Gimmick Rallye answer sheet. The winner is the car which comes in within the specified time with the best poker hand, assembled from the five cards drawn.

Note: we are going deeper in the awards this year for the Car Show and Funkhana.

Cowtown's 2021 Event Dates – we invite you to mark your calendar for these fun events.

- Autocross Scramble: September 18-19, 2021 TSTC Airport in Waco consisting of 14 Low-Speed Autocrosses. The TSTC location is on the north-end of Waco. It is about the same distance for most of us as Mineral Wells was plus TSTC has indoor restrooms and we have lunch inside the building.
- 1st Annual Larry Hoaldridge Memorial Event: tentative date of 11/6-7/21. Due to the anticipated price jump at TMS, we are still entertaining other venues to host this event and possibly a date change.


