





#### **NATIONAL CORVETTE MUSEUM**

The National Corvette Museum showcases the Chevrolet Corvette, an American sports car that has been in production since 1953. It is located in Bowling Green, Kentucky, off Interstate 65's Exit 28. It was constructed in 1994, and opened to the public in September of that year. Cowtown has a couple of bricks at the museum (shown below) and you can obtain your own brick there to mark your spot in Corvette History.

#### **NCCC EVENTS**






