





Jordan Taylor, driving the Number 3 C8.R, secured the pole position in Friday's qualifying session and started Saturday's race ahead of teammate Tommy Milner in the Number 4 C8.R. Millner was never more than a second off Taylor's pace throughout their stints in Saturday's race. Milner managed to pass Taylor while in traffic just past the halfway point in the race. Taylor was the first of the Corvettes to the pits, and that stop put Antonio Garcia in the Number 3 car for the remainder of the race. On the next lap, Milner pitted to be replaced by co-driver Nick Tandy, who exited the pits ahead of the Number 3 car and stayed ahead until the checkered flag. Even while navigating traffic of the slower GTD class cars, Tandy and Garcia were practically nose to tail, with Tandy crossing the finish line just 0.75 second ahead of Garcia. Wow ... talk about close!!

VETERANS DAY PARADE

FORT WORTH – Bells of peace will ring, "Taps" sound, and a 21-gun salute will signal the start of this year's

102nd Veterans Day Celebration on Thursday, Nov. 11, 2021 at 11 a.m. in the Panther Island Pavilion, Fort Worth parking lot.

The Tarrant County Veterans Day Parade is a chance for participants and spectators alike to bring and ring bells in remembrance of the guns falling silent, and bells tolling on the Western Front to signal the end of World War I -"the war to end all wars."

"Bells of Peace" was developed by the WWI Centennial Commission in concert with the Society of the Honor Guard (Tomb of the Unknown Soldier), the VFW, and American Legion to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the armistice in 2018. The Doughboy Foundation then launched the initiative nationwide. It was successful and the foundation's been promoting Bells of Peace as an annual moment of remembrance ever since.

Bells will toll in communities across the country – in places of worship, schools, town halls, and cemeteries – to mark Veterans Day. Locally, bells will toll to launch the Veterans Day parade, hosted by the City of Fort Worth and organized by the Tarrant County Veterans Council (TCVC).

A military flyover about 11 a.m. will kick off the Veterans Day parade. A motorcade will then roll down North Forest Park Blvd. along the Clear Fork section of the Trinity Trails system to Rotary Plaza., then back to Panther Island. Spectators can picnic along the Trinity River while viewing the parade on the west side of downtown Fort Worth.

"Battlefront at Home... Saluting our Veterans & First Responders" is the theme of this year's parade. The TCVC is busy putting final touch on this special event. The parade website Tarrant County Veterans Day Parade contains extensive information about viewing, supporting, and taking part in this year's celebration.

"Everyone can join in our salute to veterans and first responders who've given so much during the pandemic," notes Parade Chairman Ken Cox. "Simply visit our website where you can learn how to support, volunteer and take part.

"Will you consider being part of our celebration?" Cox asks. "If you're not available, please help us spread the word. Hope y'all can join our Cowtown salute on Veterans Day!"

We held our 1st Annual Shine & Rallye Event on Oct 16 & 17, 2021. Saturday's NCCC Car Show was held concurrently with **Cowtown's 19th Annual Corvette Show**; separate registration and awards. Sunday morning, we hosted another NCCC People's Choice Car Show, followed by a Gimmick & Chance Rallye at Fat Daddy's, like we did in May of this year. Due to short notice of switching these sanctions from the cancelled autocross, we did experience

a smaller volume of participants than at our May event; we did make a profit though. Next year we would include a Funkhana to make the event more appealing. Additionally, it would be better advertised so we can obtain a larger volume of participants.

Cowtown's Remaining 2021 Event Dates – we would ask that you to mark your calendar for **one remaining Cowtown hosted event.** NEXT WEEKEND, we also need your assistance to make our last 2021 Cowtown NCCC Event Successful. Regardless if you can come out for a half day, full day or both days, we need workers for these events in multiple areas. Remember, the best seats at an event are being a Corner Worker and Richard Downing has volunteered again to be in the chairfor that Don Wells is handling transportation of the Club Trailer. Mary Pittman is handling registration. Vicki Currey & Mary Pittman are heading up Timing. Larry Currey, Don Wells and Jim Dawson that have volunteered as our Starters. Larry Schaapveld is chief Safety Tech, he will need others to assist. We will also have a runner (young) for each corner so our members don't need to chase cones.

1st Annual Larry Hoaldridge Memorial Event: November, 6-7, 2021. – Mineral Wells Heliport, TX. This event will consist of 14 Low-Speed Autocrosses using 10 CTV sanctions, 2 Corvette Club of Texas (CCT) and 2 Tin Hall Toys (THT). We are planning a small celebration at the host hotel Saturday evening.

Note: This is the last auto related event that will ever be held at this location, which CTV (and others) have used for over 3 decades. It is also the last sanctioned event for the 2021 SWR Competition Year and last but not least, we are finally able to hold the 1st Annual Lary Hoaldridge Memorial Event.


