





Corvette Racing at the 24 Hours of Daytona: The Race in Pictures

Always action-packed and full of drama, the Rolex 24 Hours of Daytona is one of IMSA's premier events. Here's the week from the perspective of the Corvette Racing team.



The C8.R driver line-up largely remains the same. The Number Three Corvette is driven by Antonio Garcia and Jordan Taylor, with Nicky Catsburg co-driving the long endurance races, and the

Number Four Corvette is driven by Tommy Milner, Nick Tandy, with newcomer Marco Sorenson assisting in the longer races.



Number Three Corvette suffered an electrical system issue, which necessitated a stay in the garage while the team replaced the alternator. Then the Number Four car was sidelined for a substantial amount of time after being hit from behind by one of the Prototype cars while maneuvering to avoid a collision. The damage was severe enough to require the exhaust, starter, and rear diffuser to be replaced. As a result, the Number Three and Four Corvettes finished sixth and tenth respectively



Tommy Milner added, "It's obviously frustrating to have the problems we did. Even so, and looking at the ultimate pace, I don't think we had the car today to race for the win potentially. You never know in these kinds of races. If you're there at the end and you're close, anything can happen. That was kind of our goal today and obviously we didn't achieve that."

TRAINERS FOR THE TRAINEES

As most of you know *March 20th* is the CTV practice autocross and drivers training event.

A newspaper story on April Fool's Day suggested that, to further European integration, the UK was to convert to driving on the right. However, owing to the huge amount of work this conversion would cause, it

Myanmar (formerly Burma) was a British colony until 1948, and drove on the left until 1970, when it changed sides. It is said that the ruler of the country at that time, dictator General Ne Win, ordered everyone to start driving on the right side of the road. However, virtually every vehicle is right-hand-drive, since there are still many old cars and buses driving around and almost all the modern cars are second-hand imports from Japan. You can still even see old traffic lights in downtown Rangoon on the wrong side of the road.

• Almost always, in countries where one drives on the right-hand side of the road, the cars are built so that the driver sits on the left-hand side of the car. Conversely, driving on the left-hand side of the road usually

• All early automobiles in the USA (driving on the right-hand side of the road) were right-hand-drive, following the practice established by horse-drawn carriages. They changed to left-hand-drive in the early 1900s as it was decided that it was more practical to have the driver seated near the centreline of the road, both to judge the space available when passing oncoming cars, and to allow front-seat passengers to get out of

Ford changed to left-hand-drive in the 1908 model year. A Ford catalogue from 1908 explains the benefits of placing the controls on the left side of the car: "The control is located on the left side, the logical place, for the following reasons: Travelling along the right side of the road the steering wheel on the right side of the car made it necessary to get out on the street side and walk around the car. This is awkward and especially inconvenient if there is a lady to be considered. The control on the left allows you to step out of the car on to the curbing without having had to turn the car around. In the matter of steering with the control on the right, the driver is farthest away from the vehicle he is passing, going in opposite direction; with it

Nowadays, the driver always sits on the side of the car that is nearest to the centre line. However, there are a few exceptions, among other things certain kinds of specialised service vehicles. For example, streetsweeping vehicles may have the reverse driving position to place the driver next to the gutter. Italian-built trolley buses were right-hand-drive for many years in order to observe the passenger doors better.

Some countries restrict imports of vehicles that have their controls arranged differently from the norm for the country, but foreign tourists are usually allowed to drive their odd vehicles while they visit. Nonstandard vehicles may be required to have a sign on the back announcing this, which typically reads, "Righthand-drive" or "Left-hand-drive" or just "RHD" or "LHD". Cambodia (which drives on the right) banned all right-hand-drive vehicles in January 2001 in order to control imports of stolen and smuggled vehicles from Thailand. It required all car owners to have their vehicles modified so that the steering wheel is on the left or risk confiscation. About 80% of the officially registered vehicles in the country had to be modified in

Japanese people sometimes import left-hand-drive models of cars, whereas the standard Japanese car in Japan is right-hand-drive. This is done purely for prestige. A Mercedes or BMW with the steering wheel on the left is seen as more authentic and carries something of a cachet. It is also more expensive than the
