

THE GOOD,

Corvette Racing had the pole starting position for 1 & 2...which had never happened in corvette racing. Both the 63 and the 64 cars were early strong leaders even with the added weight penalty and air flow restrictor plates they were forced to use to allow the slower cars the opportunity to keep up.



THE BAD,

The No. 63 Corvette C8.R of Antonio Garcia was leading in GTE Pro by a significant 17 seconds at the eighthour mark when it suffered a strange left rear suspension failure on the Mulsanne Straight, forcing the Spaniard to limp the car back to the pits for lengthy repairs.





THE UGLY

With the No. 63 car out of the fight for the lead, the team's full focus turned to the No. 64 car. British driver Alexander Sims was leading the GTE Pro class by over a minute with roughly six hours remaining when he was hit by the AF Corse-run LMP2 car of amateur driver François Perrodo.

The Frenchman was in a duel with another LMP2 car and pulled out to pass in the draft not knowing the yellow Corvette of Sims was alongside, bodychecking Sims and sending the car hard into the outside metal barrier.

THE WORLD'S FIRST SPEEDING TICKET

It's never a good feeling to see those flashing lights in your rearview mirror, knowing you might be getting a speeding ticket. But how do you think the first person to receive one felt? It's a safe bet he was very surprised.

The first speeding ticket issued to a motorist took place on January 28th, 1896, in Paddock Wood, Kent, in England. A constable spotted a fast driver named Walter Arnold speeding down the street. Since the constable didn't have one of the early motorized vehicles, he had to give chase on his bike.

When the constable stopped Arnold after a five-mile chase, he cited him for speeding. Arnold had been going four times over the posted speed limit. While that sounds like a lot, the speed limit at the time was a blistering 2 mph. Arnold was fined a shilling for speeding at 8 mph. Arnold could have avoided the citation, however, since the law stated that a person could go over the 2 mph speed limit if they had someone else in front of them waving a red flag to alert anyone on the street of their breakneck speed. The speed limit was later changed that same year to 14 mph.

Interestingly, Arnold was one of the sons of the William Arnold & Sons company, which later became the Arnold Motor Carriage Company in 1896. They had acquired a license to build Benz automobiles in the United Kingdom in 1895, and Arnold was driving one of these automobiles at the time of his speeding infraction in 1896.

The first ticket given in the U.S. happened a few years later than the one in England in 1899. A New York City taxicab driver named Jacob German was stopped on Lexington Street in Manhattan by a police officer on a bicycle for going 12 mph when the posted speed limit was 8 mph. He was lucky he hadn't been stopped while taking a turn because the speed limit for that was 4 mph. German wasn't just issued a citation and sent on his way, however, he was thrown in jail.

But these first speeding perpetrators weren't believed to have been given a paper ticket for their infractions. That was believed to have taken place in 1904 in Dayton, Ohio, to a driver named Harry Myers. He too was cited for speeding at 12 mph and was issued what is believed to be the first paper ticket for speeding.

If those are possibly the slowest speeding drivers that have been issued a ticket, who were the fastest? In the United Kingdom, Timothy Brady was stopped for going 172 mph (276.8 km/h) in 2007 in Oxfordshire in his Porsche 911 Turbo. He was banned from driving for 3 years and spent 10 weeks in jail. But the fastest convicted speeder in that country was a motorcyclist named Daniel Hicks. He was clocked at 175 mph (281.6 km/h) in 2000 while on a Honda Fireblade motorcycle. He got six weeks in jail and a driving ban of two years.

But those examples may not be the fastest speeder recorded in the world since records of who may have gone faster have been difficult to come by. There are a few that have been chalked up to urban legends and have never been proven. One was said to have taken place in Texas when a Koenigseggs CCR, a Swedish sports car, was clocked at 242 mph in a 75-mph zone, but this was never confirmed. The highest speeding incident with the most evidence seems to have taken place in Minnesota in 2004 when a motorcyclist was clocked at 205 mph in a 65-mph zone. The rider was cited for not having a motorcycle license, reckless driving, and going over 140 mph in a 65-mph zone, but it was difficult for the officers to determine his exact speed.

NCCC CONVENTION

ATLANTIC CITY NJ JUNE 12-17 2022

Debbie and I were fortunate enough to go to the 63rd NCCC Convention this year which was sponsored by the East Region. We have some very good friends, John and Michele Cantelmo, who were very instrumental in the planning of this week. John was the Convention Director and Michele, along with her duties as NCCC Director of Sponsorship and Charities, was in charge of several of the programs for the week. We arrived at Harrah's Hotel and Casino on Saturday afternoon and immediately were hit with the sounds and smells of the casino. Needless to say, we stayed away from that area most of the time. The reason for this was the tobacco smoke and the eventuality of losing money. One of the members from Michigan did win \$17,000 one evening, but lost it the next day. Our check in at the hotel and then Convention Registration area went very well.

We have been going to NCCC conventions since 1977, and along with holding regional and national offices, we have made many friends all over the United States who also attend these conventions. Since our organization has aged considerably, it is heartwarming to see members, into their 90's, helping their spouses with their walkers and wheelchairs get to the various activities. Some of these older members have trouble walking, but then the next day you will see them competing successfully in the speed events. Corvettes and their NCCC "family" are definitely important to them.

We went to the Welcome Party Sunday evening, walked through the Concours and People's Choice car shows on Monday, watched the indoor Funkhana, attended a very informative Michelin Tire Tech Talk as well as the Championship Recognition dinner that evening.

On Tuesday morning, we drove about an hour to the New Jersey Motorsports Park which was the location of both the High and Low Speed Events. The Low Speed event was laid out on a large parking lot which was also used as the staging area for both events. The High Speed event was on a 1.9 mile road course which consisted of 10 turns. The fastest cars could average 95 mph and achieve a top speed of over 160 mph at the finish line. Practice runs consisted of four cars at a time on the track and were allotted as many laps as they could accomplish in twelve minutes. The official timed runs had a warmup lap and two timed runs with a flying start at the end of the warmup lap. The fastest time was approximately 72 ½ seconds. Every driver I spoke with was very impressed with the track and how the event was handled. The event was enhanced with a very professional announcer who helped with the organization of the drivers.

The Rallye was held on Wednesday and since our Toyota Corolla rent car did not qualify as an entrant, we went on a very informative tour of Cape May. We could have probably won an economy run. The day ended with a very nice Hawaiian Luau Party around the indoor pool.

The Drags had been cancelled on Thursday so there were tours available to some of the sites in New Jersey. One of the tours was shortened since there were storms and lightning in the area and the Captain didn't want to venture out in his aluminum boat. The night ended with a Pajama Party and the valve cover races. A ten year old FCOA member added excitement to the event as he went head to head with his adult competitors.

The week ended for us Thursday night since we had prior commitments on Friday but not before we won a set of race tires. You could probably hear Debbie's reaction from Mansfield. She was VERY excited!!

There was one casualty during the week. Mike Godfrey, RCD from the Indiana Region had a stroke and fell in his room at the hotel. He was taken to the hospital in Atlantic City where X-rays showed he had also fractured 3 or 4 vertebrae in his neck. He is supposed to be taken by ambulance to Indiana for surgery. The last we heard, he was paralyzed on his right side but was very hopeful that the paralysis was not permanent. He was reportedly in good spirits. Earlier in the week, Mike had been awarded the Don Hoskins Memorial Award as selected by the NCCC President. This award is presented to a member who has served the organization well and Mike has certainly done that.

Convention #64 will be back in Bowling Green, June 10-16. It was last held in Bowling Green in 2017. Attendance is often higher there due to the location in the country as well as the attraction that the NCM has for many members. Make plans to check it out next year!


