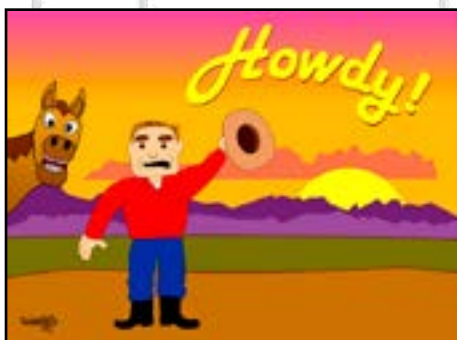

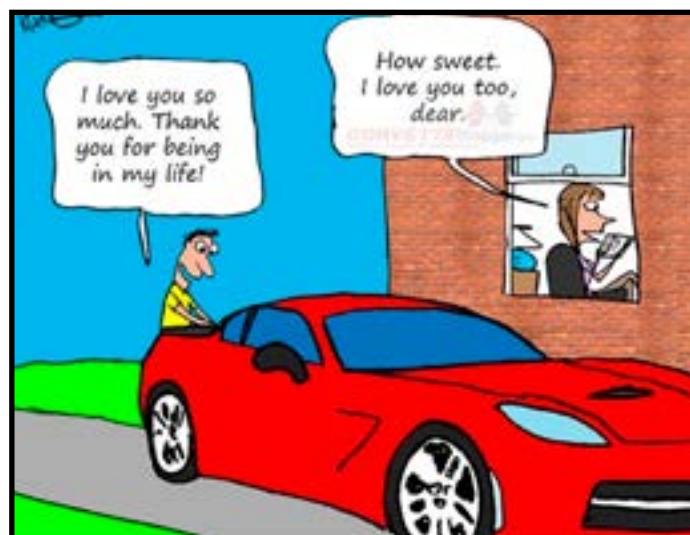

Corvette Z06 GT3.R To Be Revealed on January 27th



The Corvette Z06 GT3.R will apparently debut at Daytona International Speedway in conjunction with the Rolex 24 At Daytona, that same weekend.



The Corvette Z06 GT3.R is closely related to the street going C8 Corvette Z06, with both machines sharing the same aluminum chassis and naturally aspirated 5.5L V8 LT6 engine, plus similar aerodynamic features as well.

Development and testing for the Corvette Z06 GT3.R has been ongoing since late 2021, with the Corvette Racing team focused on making the racer not only competitive, but driver-friendly as well. The Corvette Z06 GT3.R will get its official competition debut in the 2024 calendar year.

Howdy ...

Ever wonder how America’s sports car got its name? Originally Harley Earl had named the sport car design the Opel Project. Named after a German auto brand that GM bought in 1929. If that name sounds familiar – to you it might. I remember one of my best friends in high school getting a brand-new Opel Kadett our senior year for \$1,399. It was a beauty, looking like a refrigerator on wheels and marketed in the US briefly by Buick. Also, if you’ve rented cars in Europe, they’re still around and still non-descript. The name Opel was just not right.

Briefly the project became the Cougar whaaaat ?!?! That brings back memories of the Mercury Cougar of the late 60’s. Thank goodness this didn’t last long, although badging of the Cougar did show up in the early design front fenders, hood emblem and horn button before the car came to market.

Finally, Dec 10th, 1952, the name was changed to Corvette at the suggestion of Chevrolet PR photographer Myron Scott. Scott knew the name Corvette from WWII ships. They were lightweight, agile and highly successful war-ships. The name stuck and Cougar was saved for Ford to use on its upscale Mustang (Mercury Cougar) that lasted only a few years.

The name Corvette 70 years later, remains the symbol that raises our heartbeat and makes us all feel a little extra pep in our step. Great Scott – you “did good” !
