Corvette Racing Continues...Go yellow #3

Corvette Racing Bounces Back At 2023 24 Hours Of Daytona



The No. 3 Corvette C8.R, driven by a joint effort between Antonio Garcia, Jordan Taylor and Tommy Milner, suffered a blown tire that resulted in brake damage. The Bow Tie's sole GTD entry was forced to undergo repairs to replace the race car's rear brake calipers and rotors before charging back out on track, two laps down.

The Corvette C8.R would ultimately lead 201 out of its 729 completed laps, certainly proving that it had speed. As the clock ticked into the final three hours, the Corvette Racing team had managed to claw its way back up inside the top three competitors in the GTD class. The No. 3 C8.R fought tooth and nail against the No. 14 Lexus RC F and the No. 79 Mercedes-AMG GT3 on the tricky Daytona infield road course. The No. 3 C8.R edged ahead of the Lexus, but could not rein in the Mercedes, flashing across the line 3.9 seconds back for second place.

70 years ago, at the Motorama Auto Show at the Waldorf Astoria in New York City, a legend was born.

The '53 Corvette all 235 cubic inch and 150 horsepower was not really schedule to be a production car. But after a wild scene and crowds of on-lookers made it a hit, Chevrolet agreed to build 300 cars with the first rolling out on June 30, 1953.

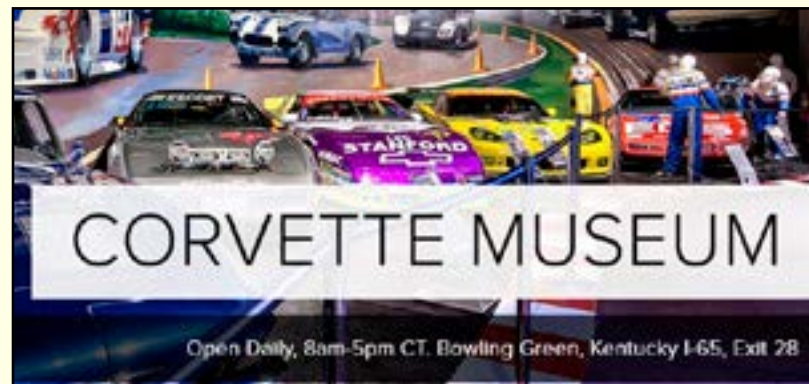
As the 2023 70th Anniversary addition is rolling down the assembly line, Corvette enthusiasts can still locate 214 of the original 300 cars, there are 3 cars known to have been demolished. But there are some missing, VINS which include 83 missing cars ranging from 010-295. Three-digit VINS can you believe that? Gone with the 83 missing Corvettes are prices from 1953 such as – Hotdogs \$0.19 / World Series Ticket \$7.00 / Pie Crust \$0.33 / Drive-in (per carload) \$1.00 / Lawn Mower \$81.95 / 6 pack of beer \$0.39 (okay – I made that one up).

Most of us don't remember these but 1953 had some major events – such as Hank Williams death / Lucy giving birth to Little Ricky on I Love Lucy / double-helix structure of DNA was discovered / Ian Fleming publishes "Casino Royale", the first James Bond novel / first men to summit Mount Everest / Queen Elizabeth II was crowned / USSR tested its first hydrogen bomb / first Playboy published, featuring Marilyn Monroe on the cover / cigarette smoking is reported as causing lung cancer / and best of all, **the first Corvette is built in Flint, Michigan.**

1953 that was a good year and thanks to Chevy we're all still having lots of fun.

His Governors reports were always a highlight of monthly meetings, because at the end of the report, he would remark, "Well, since I have the floor", and relate yet another bad joke or pun. He loved the various Corvettes that he owned over the years and would not hesitate to race them or volunteer at Corvette events. Scott was known to Corvette enthusiasts nationwide in the Corvette community and will be missed.
