



Additionally, all the Budgets and P&Ls for events and socials are there too.





Howdy Cowtown ...

We all heard of the sinkhole that swallowed up eight classic Vettes. Believe it or not, that was February 12, 2014, at 5:44am - almost ten years ago. The cause was attributed to the region's geology and National Corvette Museums location atop soluble limestone and caves. Experts from various fields including geologists, engineers and construction specialist were called. The first step was stabilizing the area by filling in voids and ensure the ground was stable. Next came the careful process of retrieving the cars. Some visible, while others were completely buried. Cranes were used to extract each car and minimize further damage. The eight cars swallowed by the sinkhole included a 1993 ZR1 'Spyder', a 2009 Blue ZR1, a black '62 Roadster convertible, a '84 Pace Car, the 1 millionth Corvette (a white '92), a '93 40th Anniversary, a '01 Z06, and the 1.5 millionth White '09 Corvette.

As the rescued cars were brought to the surface, they revealed varying degrees of damage. Some were remarkably well-preserved considering the circumstances of a fall of 60 feet, while others were significantly more affected by the collapse.

The repair of the sinkhole itself, was a massive undertaking that required significant time, effort, and resources. Engineers utilized advanced techniques like ground-penetrating radar and laser scanning to map the subsurface accurately. They then backfilled the sinkhole with a combination of crushed limestone and concrete to restore the grounds stability.

Eventually NCM reopened its doors with the recovered cars on display. Only 3 cars were completed restored. They were the Black 62 convertible, which was restored at the museum, while General Motors took over the restoration of the White '92 (1 millionth Vette) and the blue '09 ZR1.

Almost ten years later it is all there waiting for you on your next visit to Bowling Green as a member and supporter of the NCM. You might find yourself being even more selective in finding that perfect parking spot for your beloved and shiny ride.

I will pass a sign-up sheet around at the next 2 meetings. If you are not able to attend, contact me and I will add your name to the sheet.



There is nothing going on in the SW Region, due to the extreme heat.

Our autocross event at TCC on September 16-17 is coming up next. We hope the weather will give us a break by then.

The CTCC event at the TSTC Airport in Waco has officially been canceled! Counting ours, there are only three events left this season, not counting the SW Region fundraiser. Oklahoma City Corvette Club will be holding their Fall Festival (14 autocross events) at Edmond, on September 30-October 1. Longhorn is hosting their event October 21 & 22 event at Killeen and Holland. Seven autocrosses on Saturday, and 3 drags on Sunday. This will be the only drags event in the SW Region this year!

The SW Region fundraiser is still in the works, but not at Frederick, OK. The facility was not available on any of the dates we could use.

THE 80's (remember them?)

The final part of this series (to loud applause)......

Techno-Colored Dashboards

One thing drivers remember about the '80s it was the dashboards. The digital dashboards of this era were meant to represent the future. Unfortunately, all that happened was expensive dashboard replacements. The Camaro Berlinetta was one such vehicle that tried to take advantage of the digital design. Consumers didn't adapt to this at all and by the turn of the '90s, dashboards were analog again. The Cadillac brand was another home to way too many digital dashboards. There are some benefits to a digital dashboard but they weren't major. Most consumers just preferred the regular style of analog gauges as opposed to the digital dash. Still, the digital dash is a pretty notable part of '80s automotive culture.

Cylinder Deactivation

Throughout the '80s, automakers were experimenting with all kinds of new fuel management technologies. The Cylinder Deactivation was among one of the most controversial. On most of the cars that featured this technology the reliability suffered. As such, most automakers ended up moving away from Cylinder Deactivation not long after it was introduced. Cylinder deactivation has returned in some sense of the word almost 30 years later. Most modern engines have some type of deactivation, especially on pickup trucks. It's questionable how much fuel the technology saves. Most consumers went to have a reliable vehicle and with cylinder deactivation, this isn't always the case.

Paint Jobs

Remember the Baja-themed trucks of the '80s? Probably not unless you lived through it. But there was a period where automakers were going a bit over the top with paint schemes. The paint jobs of this era were notoriously flashy and most of the automakers were following with this. The problem is that 10 years down the road, most of these paint jobs had peeled or faded. Automakers are notorious when it comes to cost-cutting and it would appear that this fad was part of that. Nevertheless, if you've ever seen a pickup truck or car from the '80s, you probably remember these wild paint jobs. One of the last prominent vehicles to feature this was the Ford Ranger Splash.
